



CRIS High-Level Workplan – Committee & State Agency Roles

- The Steering Committee approved the CRIS High-Level Workplan, which will provide an organizing framework for our work ahead to ensure the full continuum of crisis response.
 - **Objective 1:** A place to contact NSPL call centers
 - **Objective 2:** Someone to come Mobile crisis rapid response teams
 - **Objective 3:** A place to go Broad range of crisis stabilization services
 - **Objective 4:** Pre- and Post-Crisis Care Immediately upstream and downstream of crisis events
 - **Objective 5:** Crisis system infrastructure and oversight
- State agencies are responsible for implementation of this work, and the Steering Committee, CRIS and Subcommittees will be providing recommendations.
 - State agency partners will be providing regular and timely updates regarding implementation planning across the crisis response continuum to engage meaningful committee feedback.

First meeting: March 17, 2022 Next meeting: March 29, 2022 Cadence: Monthly

- Cross-System Collaboration Subcommittee Charge Examine and define complementary roles and interactions among crisis system stakeholders across the continuum of crisis response.
 - Provide guidance on system interactions across the elements of the crisis response continuum to make recommendations as state agencies develop implementation plans.
 - Identify issues for consideration in development of system that supports cross system collaboration.
 - Inform planning for resources needed.

First meeting: March 21, 2022 Cadence: Monthly

- Technology Subcommittee To examine and advise on issues and requirements related to the technology and platform needed to manage and operate the behavioral health crisis response and suicide prevention system.
 - Identify issues for consideration in development of the technology and platform needed to support HB 1477 requirements.
 - Review and provide input into HB 1477 Section 109 Technical and Operational Plan under development by HCA and DOH.


- Lived Experience Subcommittee To provide diverse lived experience perspectives into the development of the Washington behavioral health crisis response and suicide prevention system.

DISCUSSION: CENTERING EQUITY IN OUR WORK

HB 1477

- The CRIS Committee is charged with advising the Steering Committee in developing recommendations for an integrated behavioral health crisis response and suicide prevention system, including:
 - "Recommendations to promote equity in services for individuals of diverse circumstances of culture, race, ethnicity, gender, socioeconomic status, sexual orientation, and for individuals in tribal, urban, and rural communities."

Steering Committee and CRIS Committee Charters

The CRIS Committee and Steering Committee "will center equity - racial equity, gender equity, equity for people with disabilities, geographic equity, and other forms of equity - in its work."

- At the last CRIS committee, CRIS members discussed ways to embed equity into the High-Level Workplan for redesigning the behavioral health crisis response and suicide prevention system.
- Today we want you to review the draft summary of CRIS member comments and provide feedback:
 - 1. We organized CRIS member comments into categories of recommendations (e.g., Implementation, Operations, Capacity Building, and Policy). Does this seem like the right approach? Are these four categories the right categories?
 - 2. As next steps, we propose the following:
 - i. Send draft summary to CRIS members and request additional thoughts for embedding equity.
 - ii. Update summary based on further input from CRIS members and the Steering Committee.
 - iii. Develop draft recommendations based on the updated summary to promote equity in services for individuals in diverse circumstances.
 - iv. Bring back draft recommendations to the Steering Committee for review and approval.
