Bull's-eye diagramming

Each eye diagramming is a useful exercise to visualize priorities and trigger their implementation in the behavioral health system.

Items with a high impact can have a higher priority on other priorities, and it's important to consider them first.

Revising the impact and difficulty of each item separately can help the group reach a consensus and make a plan.

Evaluating Ideas

The table is a way to visualize the different ideas that have been proposed by subgroup members. Each idea is given a score.

- Emergent Consideration:** This refers to the leading interest in the particular idea. This includes public and community interest. Items with a green dot are referred to having "high" emergent consideration and the chance of implementation, however, it is evidence that support the idea. Items with a yellow dot are referred to having a "moderate" chance of support.
- Has sufficient clarity & information to support recommendation development:** This refers to the fact that the idea is clear and that there is enough information to support the idea. Items with a green dot are referred to having a "high" level of clarity and information to support recommendation development. Items with a yellow dot are referred to having a "moderate" level of clarity and information to support recommendation development.
- Political Will:** This refers to the likelihood that the idea will be supported by policymakers and other stakeholders. Items with a green dot are referred to having a "high" level of political will. Items with a yellow dot are referred to having a "moderate" level of political will.

The table is based on conversations had to date. The characterization of an idea may change as the group continues to discuss it.

BHI Subgroup Recommendation

Finance behavioral health care coordination for children, teens and families in primary care, & sustain and scale Community Health Workers for pediatric behavioral health to perform activities of care coordination.

Care coordination is deliberately organizing patient care and sharing information among all team members to achieve safer and more effective care. Increase Medicaid reimbursement rates to fully fund the cost of pediatric screening in primary care settings to include the cost of necessary follow-up when behavioral health issues are identified, such as helping children and families connect to services; and direct Health Care Authority to adopt General Behavioral Health Integration code 99484 (at Medicare rate) to adequately fund reimbursement for care coordination activities performed by both clinicians and non-licensed professionals, including Community Health Workers, on behalf of children and teens with behavioral health diagnoses.


