Biennium Modality Contract Type Funding Source (MCTFS) and State Special Project Codes Criminal Justice TARGET Tip Sheet

This document is designed to help you choose the correct Modality/Contract Type/Fund Source (MCTF) and State Special Project Code for each criminal justice client.

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Does this client qualify as a criminal justice client?

There are multiple variables you may need to consider before you code a client as a criminal justice client. Although we recommend you discuss who qualifies for reimbursement as a criminal justice client with your agency's administrators, here are some tips.

If your agency has a contract with the DBHR, a county human service department, or an alcohol and drug abuse coordinator's office for services to criminal justice clients, then:

- <u>Tip</u> Client eligibility criteria in the contract will probably make reference to language such as:
 - Adults with an addiction or a substance abuse problem that, if not treated, would result in addiction, against whom a prosecuting attorney in Washington State has filed charges.
 - Alcohol and drug treatment services and treatment support services to adult or juvenile offenders within a drug court program as defined in RCW 70.96A.055 and RCW 2.28.170.
- <u>Tip</u> Clients who are on a deferred prosecution for a driving under the influence (DUI) typically do **not** qualify for reimbursement under the eligibility criteria of the DBHR or county contracts but there may be exceptions. It is best to discuss deferred prosecutions with your agency administrators.
- <u>Tip</u> Clients may be eligible for more than one funding source in your DBHR or county contract. For example, a client could be eligible for Medicaid/T-19 or ADATSA and still be a criminal justice client. Since you can only code the client in TARGET by one fund source (at a time) you will need to discuss the coding options with your agency's administrators.

If your agency has a contract with either the DOC or the Juvenile Rehabilitation Administration (JRA) for services to criminal justice clients, then:

<u>Tip</u> - Client eligibility criteria in the DOC or JRA contracts will probably state the client is under the supervision of either the DOC or JRA.


If your agency has a contract with a federal agency or a federal project named Office of Justice Programs (OJP) or High Intensive Drug Trafficking Area (HIDTA) for services to criminal justice clients, then:

<u>Tip</u> - Review the client eligibility requirement listed in the contract.

How do we use the following charts to ensure proper TARGET coding?

- 1. Go to the appropriate section that identifies the Modality of Service the client received:
 - a. Assessment and Community Based Services (includes Non-ADATSA Assessment, Intensive Outpatient, Outpatient, Methadone/Opiate Substitution Tx, Detoxification) or
 - b. Residential Services
- 2. Identify the "Revenue Stream" to be used to pay for the service delivered.
- 3. Select the appropriate MCTF (Modality, Contract Type, Fund Source) for the service delivered.
- 4. Select the appropriate State Special Project Code.
- 5. Ensure that TARGET entry includes both a MCTF and State Special Project Code for each criminal justice record.

With other funding sources:

If a criminal justice client receives services funded by other DBHR revenues (such as ADATSA, Grant in Aid, Treatment Expansion) use the MCTF code applicable to that revenue source.

The following is an example of codes for a criminal justice client that receives ADATSA services:

With *local government taxes*:

Local (city or county) taxes are used in three different ways to purchase treatment services. These are:

1. To meet the 10% match requirement of RCW 70.96A.047 or the dollar-for-dollar match requirement of RCW 2.28.170.

2. Under the therapeutic court provisions of RCW 82.14.460 shall code these services with the Contract Type of "Local Sales Tax." The county may use these funds to fulfill the match requirements under RCW 70.96A.047 or RCW 2.28.170. If the county chooses to use the funds as part of the RCW 70.96A, the services should be recorded in TARGET as follows:

3. A county or city government may use local tax revenues to purchase chemical dependency treatment services that are not used to meet the RCW 70.96A.047or RCW 2.28.170 match requirements nor are funds generated under RCW 82.14.460. This occurs when a county or a city allocates local tax revenues directly to a court.

Residential Services

Criminal justice clients who participate in residential services (intensive inpatient, long-term residential care, recovery house) will be funded in two ways. These are:

- 1. Under the residential contract between DBHR and the residential agency.
- 2. By an arrangement between the county and the residential agency.

The counties have the responsibility of developing a process of communicating State Special Project codes to residential agencies for services to criminal justice clients.

Funded by a contract between DBHR and a residential agency:

For criminal justice clients who participate in residential services under the DBHR contract with a residential agency, there is not a MCTF code that specifically includes the term "Criminal Justice." Residential agencies should continue to use the MCTF code they have used since the inception of TARGET 2000.

Department of Corrections

There are special considerations for DOC clients:

• In all cases, you must enter the Governing County Code of "Dept of Corrections."

There are two circumstances that require DOC agencies to enter a **County** Special Project Code **in addition** to a **State** Special Project Code. These are:

- 1. Those clients released from a county jail. The County Special County Project Code is "DOC County."
- 2. Those clients receiving treatment services for a co-occurring disorder. The County Special County Project Code is "DOC-Mental Health."

Please consult your DOC contract to determine if your agency is required to use these County Special Project Codes.
