Directors Dialogue & 2022 DBHR Legislative Update	9:45 am	Keri Waterland, Michael Langer & Kim Wright	<ul> <li>Currently DBHR is focused on Legislative Session and the budget</li> <li>15<sup>th</sup> of March – plan to return to the office for HCA in a hybrid model – some staff coming back in, some staff staying remote.</li> <li>Being able to host provider meetings, we will need a couple weeks to determine the protocols to see what that needs to be before.</li> <li>Less calls from providers with COVID related issues</li> <li>Each month DBHR host an all-provider meeting – BHAC members are welcome to attend.</li> <li>On domestic SOTU we are expanding support – we are hoping the federal budget will pass during March</li> <li>President recognized that we need a lot more people to do the work that we are needing.</li> <li>Supporting the increase of workforce in MH and SUD</li> <li>Using the words Peers at the highest level.</li> <li>Keeping an eye on what is happening in DC on peers, what might go into new legislation, what type of support is needed in BH support?</li> <li>WA is now 8 days from the end of legislative session.</li> <li>DBHR is tracking BH bills and the budget.</li> <li>Budget is starting to sound routine, but this session the house and senate are proposing a ¼ billion of investments for next session.</li> <li>Law Enforcement bills – these bills are to help "fix" HB 1310 – DBHR can help determine the minor differences once passed.</li> <li>MOUD in jails – offering medication to people in jails to help with recovery – DBHR is working on contracting with 16 facilities.</li> <li>The Blake bill investments are starting to grow and be rolled out into the state.</li> <li>For legislative update please see the DBHR 2022 Legislative PowerPoint.</li> </ul>
