## Pharmacy Point of Sale replacement project

This FAQ for the Pharmacy Point of Sale (POS) replacement project covers questions for:

- Providers, pharmacies, and hospitals
- Managed care organizations
- Drug manufacturers

### General

#### **When is the new point of sale (POS) system going live?**

The new system will go live on Saturday, June 8, 2024.

### Providers, pharmacies, and hospitals

#### **Will there be changes to group numbers, member ID numbers, or any parameters other than the BIN/PCN?**

We don't anticipate changes to group or member ID numbers or any parameters other than the BIN and PCN numbers.

#### **What changes will hospitals see after the POS replacement?**

Impacts to hospitals should be minimal and primarily focused on those with outpatient pharmacies. Pharmacies will need to change the BIN/PCN and group they bill for Apple Health (Medicaid) fee-for-service pharmacy claims. With the launch of a provider portal, the current faxing method will be replaced and now allow prescribing providers to submit their pharmacy and drug-related authorization requests and supporting documentation online.

We will host webinars and training sessions to prepare for the launch of the provider portal.
