Apple Health Expansion enrollment update

Enrollment limit has been met for individuals age 19 - 64

The enrollment limit for Apple Health Expansion has been met for individuals age 19 - 64. If you applied for Apple Health Expansion on or after June 20, 2024, and were denied because the cap was met, there are no additional steps you need to take.

There is still a possibility you may be randomly selected to enroll if space opens in the program. You may also be eligible to enroll in a qualified health plan through *Washington Healthplanfinder*. If you get selected for enrollment in Apple Health Expansion, you will receive an eligibility notice through your preferred communication method (email or mail).

Applications for individuals age 65 and older are still being accepted

The cap has not been met for individuals age 65 and older. Learn how to apply for Apple Health Expansion coverage online, over the phone, or through paper applications.

Effective at 4:30pm on Friday, 6/21, the enrollment cap has been met for the MAGI population (age 19 to 64)!

- Clients should continue to apply, to be considered if space opens in the program.
- Enrollment limit has <u>not</u> been met for those age 65 and older
 - Encourage clients to continue to apply via Washington Connection or by paper.

Immigrant Health Care coverage

- Since the Affordable Care Act, the Health Care Authority (HCA) has been serving immigrants through Washington Healthplanfinder and Washington Connection application systems.
 - Almost 100,000 immigrants have interacted with the application systems over the last year.
 - There are over 43,000 individuals without an immigration status eligible for Apple Health for Kids and Apple Health Pregnancy medical programs.





Current Immigrant Health Care coverage

- Currently, various Apple Health (Medicaid) programs serve individuals not qualified for federally subsidized coverage because of their immigration status.
- Medical Care Services (MCS)
- Alien Emergency Medical (AEM)
- Apple Health for Pregnant Individuals
- After-Pregnancy Coverage (APC)
- Apple Health for Kids



Expanding Immigrant Health Care coverage

2022

Legislature provided funding to operationalize this program and directed HCA to prepare to implement Apple Health Expansion.

2023

- Legislature directed HCA to develop a program providing equivalent Medicaid health care coverage to uninsured adults who are ineligible for other federal assistance. The proviso directed the agency to implement on July 1, 2024.
 - Program funding was not at the level requested.
 - Recognize there are more immigrant community members who would be enrolled for this program than funding can support.



Who is eligible

Washington residents who are 19 years of age and older.

Income at or below 138% of the federal poverty level.*

Not eligible for:

- Other Apple Health programs based on immigration status.
- Qualified health plans with advance premium tax credits or federally funded medical programs.

Managing enrollment

Apple Health Expansion will have limited enrollment.

- If limit has been met, an applicant who is otherwise eligible will receive a denial notice.
- All clients may purchase a qualified health plan.
 - Clients under 250% FPL are eligible for Cascade Care Savings if they enroll in a Cascade Care plan.
- In the event the program loses its funding and/or its funding becomes restricted, HCA will notify clients, providers, MCOs, key stakeholders, and community.
 - More details available on the process in early fall.



Short-term enrollment management policy

- In the event the agency determines additional individuals can be enrolled into either Classic or MAGI Apple Health Expansion. The agency will randomly select individuals who meet pre-selected criteria from the following three groups for enrollment into the Apple Health Expansion program.
 - Submitted a completed application on or after 6/20/2024,
 - Were enrolled in Apple Health for Kids, Emergency Medical (AEM), or After-Pregnancy Coverage who meet eligibility requirements for Apple Health Expansion and their coverage ended after the cap was met, or
 - Are enrolled in a qualified health plan (QHP) through Health Benefit Exchange's 1332 waiver coverage who applied after 4/30/2024.







Create a program that is like Apple Health (Medicaid) Integrated Managed Care.



Provide coverage to as many eligible individuals as possible.

Covered services

This expansion is intended to mirror the federally funded Apple Health program to the extent possible.

- Physical and behavioral health services administered by a managed care organization (MCO) and dental services will be covered directly by Apple Health.
- Nonemergency medical transportation and interpreter services will be available.
- The pharmacy benefit is Apple Health Preferred Drug List (PDL).

Privacy

- HCA is required under law and HIPAA to maintain the privacy of its clients' information.
- There are a limited number of reasons where HCA may use and disclose information, including determining eligibility for Apple Health coverage.
- The privacy policies listed below are provided to clients on a yearly basis. We do not share information with any immigration agency.

Key points for providers

Check individual's eligibility through ProviderOne.

- Apple Health Expansion enrollee cards do not identify the program enrolled in.
- There are some differences in coverage, for example services that are normally paid for by the Department of Social & Health Services are not covered.
- Apple Health Expansion enrollees cannot access Health Care Authority's Interpreter Services program. Each MCO has arranged a contractor(s) to provide interpreter services.



General principles - benefits & services

Coverage

- Generally, mirrors Apple Health (Medicaid) program for Health Care Authority (HCA) benefit structure
- Medically necessary services using medical necessity WAC
- Benefits available for 19- and 20-year-olds to mirror HCA benefit structure Similar: USPFTF, HTCC process, second opinion, self-referral, in-country care, in/out-of-state rules



General principles

Other State Agency Services

- Services delegated to other agencies are generally excluded (unfunded).
- Medicaid Waiver Services are excluded, including:
 - 1115 demonstration waiver, Medicaid Transformation services (e.g., Reentry & HRSN services)
 - 1915c Home and Community Based Services (HCBS)
 - 1915b Behavioral Health Services Only (BHSO) program
 - 1915i Supportive Supervision and Skills Restoration
 - 1915k Community First Choice



Pharmacy

Covered & carved in

- FDA approved prescription and over the counter drugs produced by rebate eligible manufacturers listed on the Apple Health Expansion Preferred Drug List (PDL).
- Medical and diabetes testing supplies as noted on the Apple Health Expansion PDL.
- Excluded or carved out
 - Non-contracted drugs (listed in IMC Contract Exhibits N and O).
 - Drugs which HCA has specifically instructed the Contractor not to cover.



Physical health

Covered & carved into AHE

Physical health benefits (align with IMC), including but not limited to:

- Emergency and hospitalization services (including administrative days).
- Mirroring Medicaid IMC carve in (e.g., transplants).
- Fitting fees for eyeglasses and lenses
- Pregnancy/Birthing/Post-partum (if not disenrolled to Apple Health FFS):
 - Included for Apple Health Expansion eligible individuals, who have not reported being pregnant (e.g., may receive coverage for the birth and are then disenrolled for twelve months post-partum).
 - Including newborn coverage for those not yet assigned client identifier at birth.



Medicaid-funded services

Apple Health Expansion Emergency Medical Care

- Program 1: Emergency Medical Conditions, including emergency department visits and unscheduled hospitalizations
- Program 2: Cancer treatment, including surgeries, radiation and chemotherapy
- Program 3: Dialysis
- Program 4: Anti-rejection medications



Behavioral Health

Covered & carved in (align with IMC), including:

- Mental health (mirror SERI and Mental Health Services billing guide)
- SUD
- ABA
- Crisis Services
 - Note: Delegated to BH-ASO (mirror Medicaid MCO structure)

Note: SPA-like services to support models of care (e.g., WISe) are contracted within Apple Health Expansion.

Note: IMD settings of all lengths of stay (unless in state contracted LTCC facilities), no recoupment process as all Apple Health Expansion is GFS paid.



Behavioral Health carve outs

Covered & carved out (align with IMC), including:

Long term civil commitments (LTCC) (HCA/DBHR contracted), carved out when care is for client in LTCC bed



Behavioral Health in wraparound

Covered by IMC/IFC Wraparound contract (align with MCO structure):

- Mirror Medicaid MCO Wraparound structure for GFS-covered services, within available resources
 - Prioritize Room and Board and mirror non-Medicaid services for models of care (e.g., PACT/IRT/New Journeys/WISe)
 - Other Behavioral Health services, within available resources



Dental

Dental Care (Mirroring Medicaid IMC carve in)

- Facility fees when dental treatment is performed in an ASC, inpatient, or outpatient setting.
- Fluoride application provided by a medical provider (non-dentist)

Dental Care by HCA/FFS (Mirroring Medicaid IMC carve out)

- Care performed by a dental provider
- Medically necessary orthodontics for ages 19-20

Note: ABCD is not applicable to contract due to age range of Apple Health Expansion contract being age 19 years and older.



Coverage for ages 19 and 20

EPSDT Medicaid regulations do not apply to Apple Health Expansion ; however, the benefit structure is set up to mirror coverage for HCA-funded elements. Examples, but not limited to:

Covered

- Chiropractic care (covered by Apple Health Expansion Health Plan)
- Wellness exams (covered by Apple Health Expansion Health Plan)
- Vision Hardware (covered by FFS)
- Orthodontics (covered by FFS)

Excluded

- Private Duty Nursing
- Personal Care



Covered & carved out

Medical Transportation (HCA)

Non-emergency, emergency, ground, air

High cost/low utilization medically necessary physical health services (HCA)

- Transgender surgery
- Hospitalizations for Rethymic implantation

Vision hardware (HCA)

Eyeglasses, frames, and lenses for 19- and 20-year-olds



Covered & carved out (cont.)

Reproductive Health

- Elective Abortion
- Sterilizations for 19- to 20-year-olds
- Maternity Support Services
- Self-referral/Reproductive Health Care services
 - Services provided by a health department when an enrollee self-refers for care, if the health department is not contracted with the Contractor





Covered

Medically necessary Skilled Nursing Facility care meeting rehabilitative or skilled nursing services (mirroring Medicaid MCO coverage).

Excluded

Long-Term Nursing Facilities (Limited program delivered by DSHS/HCS).

"Nursing facility level of care" (NFLOC), ongoing support services provided in a SNF/NF for enrollees who do not meet the criteria for rehabilitative or skilled nursing services.

Note: DSHS has been funded for a limited number of beds; thus, a waiting list for these services may exist. This program was not changed with the Apple Health Expansion implementation.



Language Access

- HCA's Interpreter Services Program will not be available for providers for members enrolled in Apple Health Expansion because the Interpreter Services Program is only available for Medicaid clients (federally funded).
- It is the responsibility of the plans to ensure that providers have the support that they need to secure language access services for Apple Health Expansion enrollees and potential enrollees at no cost to the enrollee.
- Providers should know and follow the process for contacting the plans for language access support. Providers should share this process with their internal staff so that they can successfully meet Apple Health Expansion enrollee/potential enrollee language access needs.



Not covered

- Services identified in WAC as not covered (mirrors Medicaid use of WAC to identify not covered)
 - WAC 182-501-0060^{*} with benefits coverage grid (Apple Health Expansion addition coming
 - Note: Billing Guides provide additional information to understand the benefits covered and not covered and level of FFS benefit offered.
 - Revisions to Apple Health Billing Guides will occur 7/1/24 to address Apple Health Expansion.

Excluded

- Benefits operated by other state agencies as Medicaid State Plan services
 - (not allocated in other state agency budgets):
 - Intermediate Care Facilities/ICF (DSHS)
 - Private Duty Nursing for Adults (DSHS/DDA)
 - Behavioral Rehabilitative Services/BRS (DCYF)
 - Medicaid Personal Care/MPC (DSHS)
 - Community First Choice (1915k SPA authority) (DSHS)
 - Targeted Case Management operated by DOH/DSHS/DCYF (including HIV/AIDS Case Management operated by DOH)



Excluded (cont.)

Intensive Behavioral Supportive Supervision (IBSS);

- Note: Future In Lieu Of Services will be considered for Apple Health Expansion appropriateness.
- Assisted Suicide
- Health Homes



Notes

- CPE is not applicable to this population.
- Retroactive enrollment to prior months does not apply to Apple Health Expansion.
 - Hospitalizations occurring in the month coverage is established is covered by the Apple Health Expansion Plan but if the date of admission occurs prior to enrollment the Apple Health Expansion Plan is not responsible.
 - Client may qualify for retro-eligibility under the AEM program.
- Incarceration: Apple Health Expansion eligible clients who are incarcerated will have eligibility suspended (similar to Medicaid prior to MTP 2.0) thus hospitalizations for inpatient care of enrolled and suspended clients is covered and contracted when admission occurring during the month of enrollment.



Notes (cont.)

- Extended Foster Care youth 19-20yr of age remain eligible for Apple Health Expansion Plan.
- Block Grant services (MHBG and SABG) are available through BH-ASO; No restrictions for non-citizens to receive Block Grant services.
- Value-Added Benefits may be offered by Apple Health Expansion Health Plans.
- In Lieu Of Services (ILOS) may be offered when specified in the Apple Health Expansion Contract. IMD services are the only approved ILOS for Apple Health Expansion.
