

## Washington Healthplanfinder – 10.2 System Release

### System release outage

Washington Healthplanfinder is scheduled to go live Thursday, December 22, 2022. The system will not have down time for this release.

### Foster Care Alumni

Beginning January 17, 2023, additional questions will display on the *Screen for Other Services page* for individuals aged 18-25. To identify foster care alumni who are eligible for Apple Health (Medicaid), questions related to whether an individual was in foster care when they turned 18 and in which state they resided will be added.

Individuals in foster care outside of Washington state will need to report which state they were in while in foster care.

- New applicants will be required to answer the question.
- Existing applicants will not be required to answer the question. It will default to “no.”

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## Other updates

- The correspondence WA Apple Health Information Request (EE005) will have updated language to clarify the information requested, provides acceptable forms of verification for the different income and deduction types, and presents this information in an easy-to-read table format.
- Accessibility updates have been made to the *We couldn't verify your information* modal to provide a better experience for customers using keyboards and screen readers.
- On the *Report Your Changes* page, the “Something else has changed” question will change to “Something else has changed that is not listed here.”
