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What is Medicaid Transformation?

- ▶ The federal government is investing up to \$1.5 billion for a five-year, statewide effort to show that Washington can deliver better health care for more people, while spending dollars in a smarter way for Apple Health (Medicaid) beneficiaries.

Initiative 1: Transformation Through Accountable Communities of Health









A regional approach

Accountable Communities of Health play a critical role:

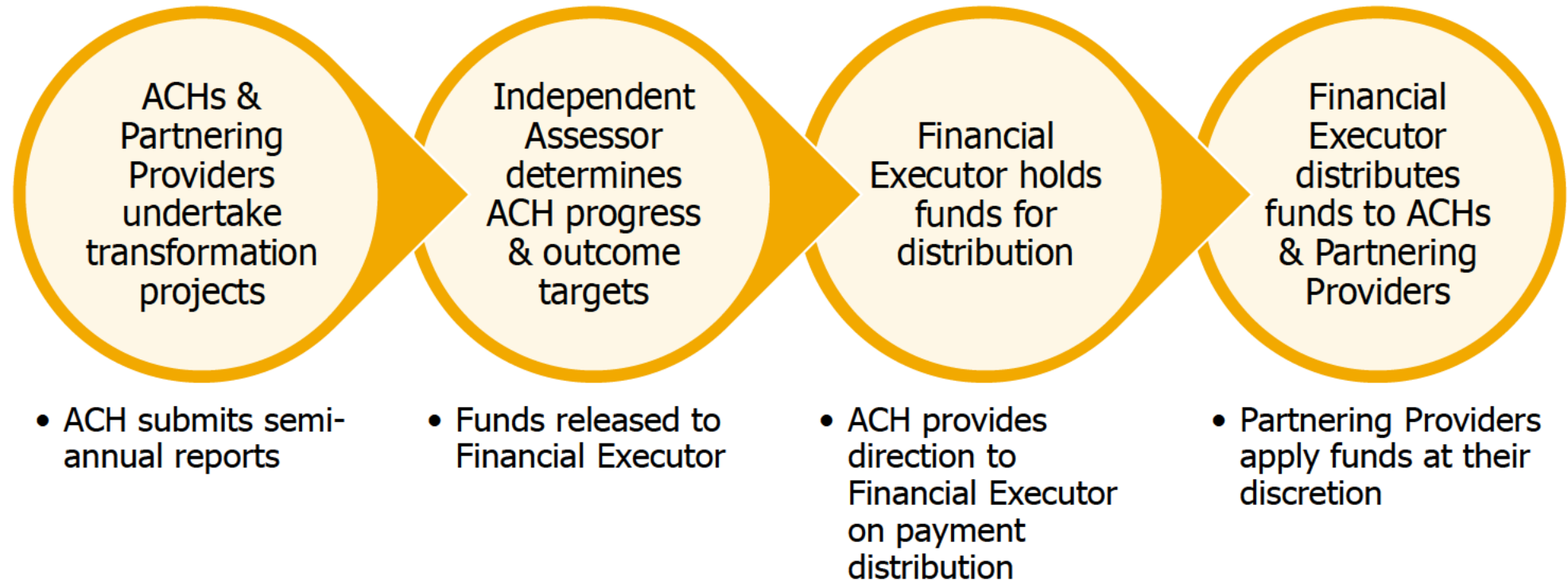
- ▶ **Coordinating** and **overseeing** regional projects aimed at improving care for Medicaid beneficiaries.
- ▶ **Implementing** transformation projects with community partners
- ▶ **Soliciting** community feedback and participation.
- ▶ **Deciding** on distribution of incentive funds to providers for achievement of defined milestones.
- ▶ **Linking** with Medicaid Managed Care Organizations on achieving value-based purchasing requirements.

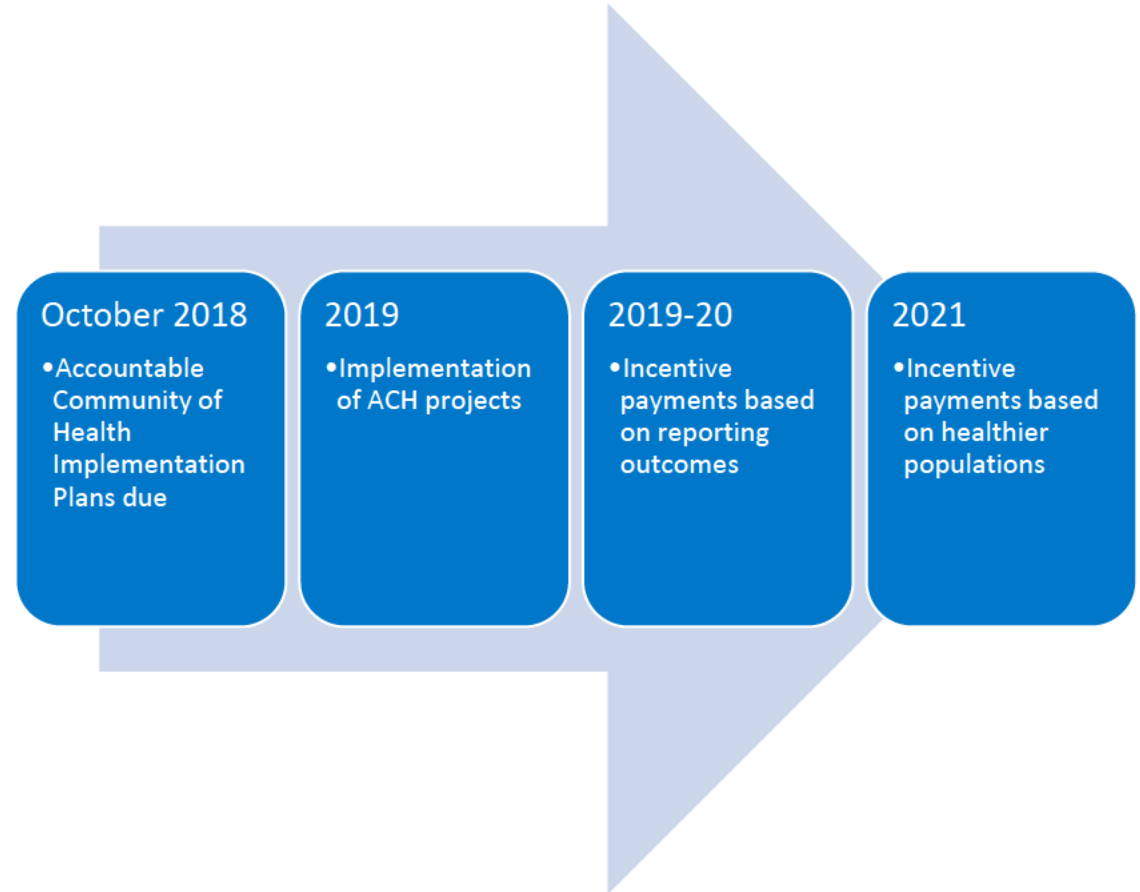

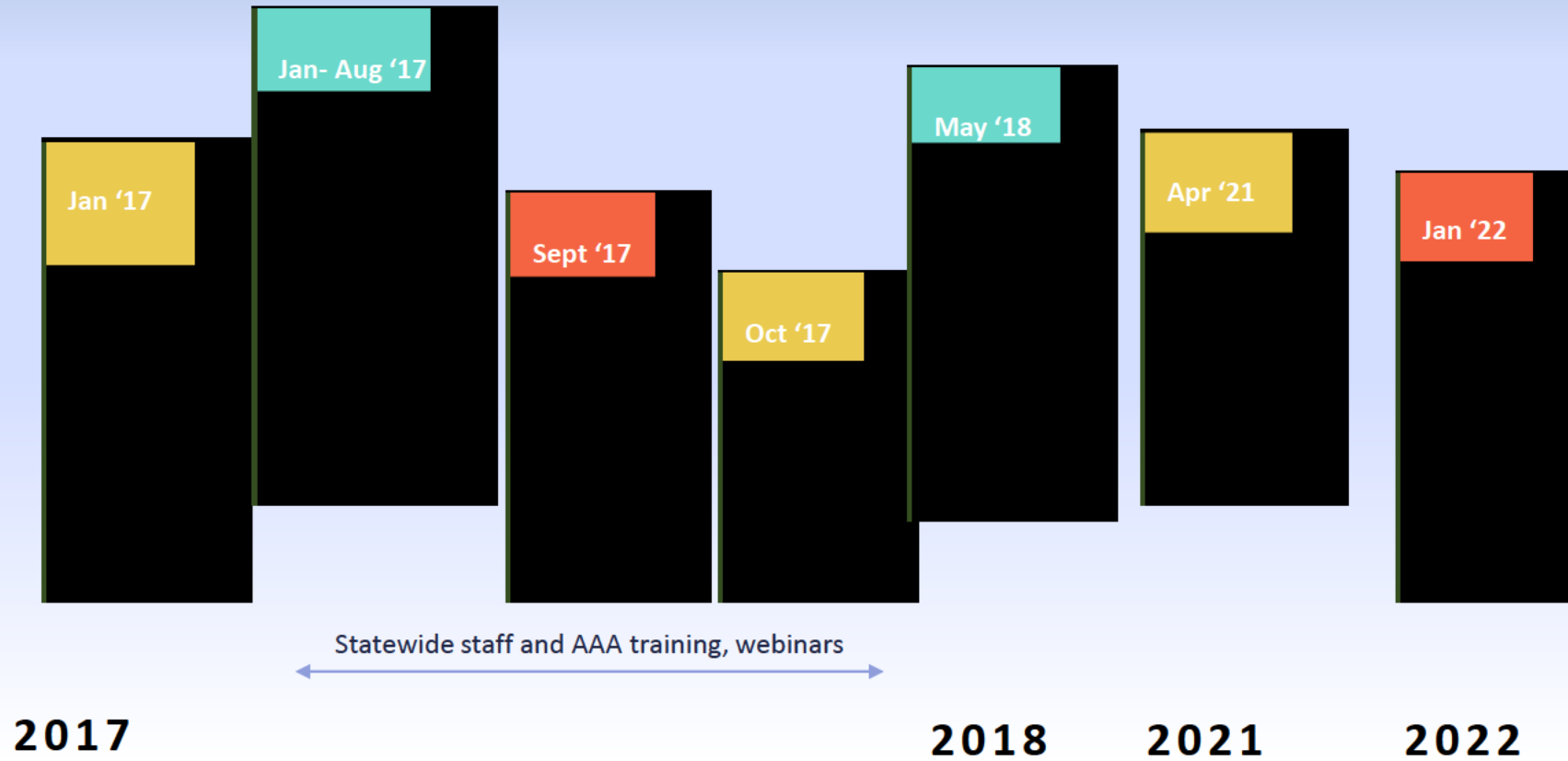

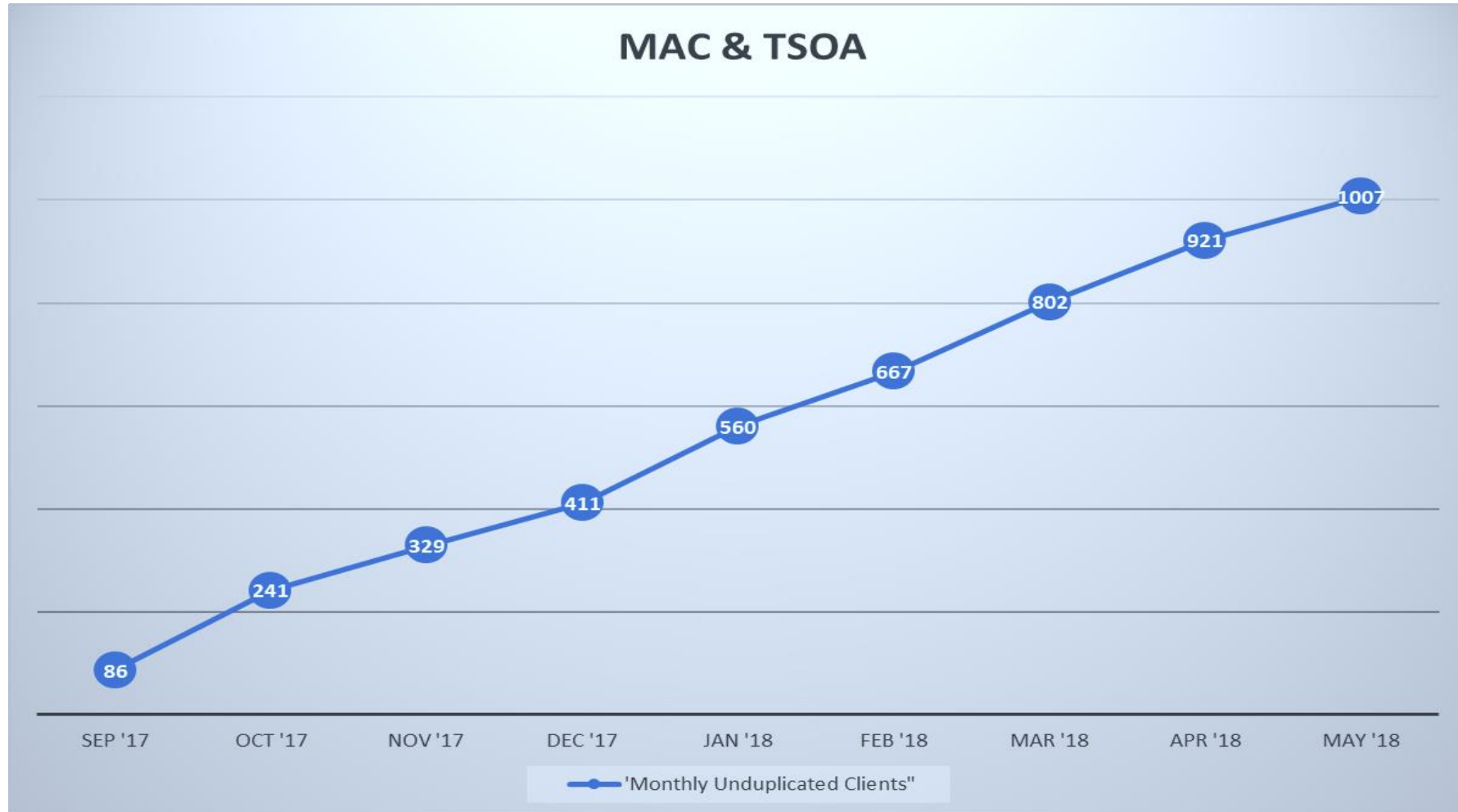

MAC & TSOA Program Timeline 2017-2022

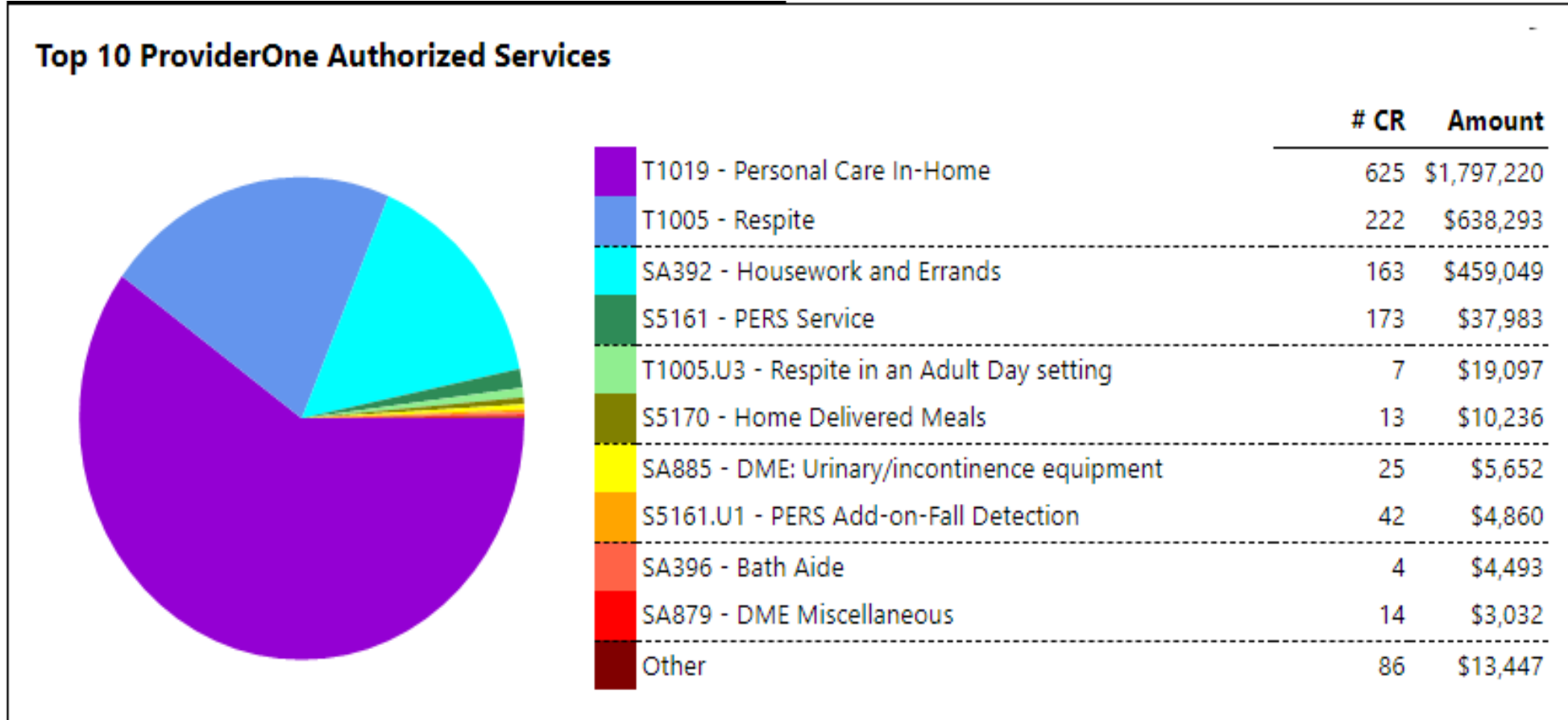


MAC & TSOA Monthly Caseload

Initiative 3: Foundational Community Supports

What is the Foundational Community Supports (FCS) Initiative?



It is...

- Medicaid benefits for help finding housing and jobs:
 - Supportive Housing to find a home or stay in your home
 - Supported Employment to find the right job, right now

It isn't...

- Subsidy for wages or room & board
- For all Medicaid-eligible people

Who is eligible to receive FCS benefits?

Supportive housing risk factors	Supported employment risk factors
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Chronic homelessness• Frequent or lengthy stays in an institutional setting (e.g. skilled nursing, inpatient hospital, psychiatric institution, prison or jail)• Frequent stays in adult residential care settings• Frequent turnover of in-home caregivers• Predictive Risk Intelligence System (PRISM)¹ score of 1.5 or above	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Housing & Essential Needs (HEN) and Aged, Blind or Disabled (ABD) enrollees• Difficulty obtaining or maintaining employment due to age, physical or mental impairment, or traumatic brain injury• SUD with a history of multiple treatments• Serious Mental Illness (SMI) or co-occurring mental and substance use disorders

1. PRISM measures how much a person uses medical, social service, behavioral health and long-term care services.

Available benefits

Supportive housing helps you find a home or stay in your home

- Housing assessments and planning
- Outreach to landlords to identify available housing
- Connection with community resources
- Assistance with housing applications
- Education, training and coaching

Supported employment helps you find the right work, right now

- Employment assessments & planning
- Outreach to employers
- Connection with community resources
- Assistance with job applications
- Education, training and coaching

Overview:

- ▶ Contracted with **HCA**
- ▶ Provides **administrative oversight** of:
 - ▶ Provider network
 - ▶ Service authorization
 - ▶ Claims payment and encounter tracking/reporting
 - ▶ Measuring outcomes and quality improvement
 - ▶ Sustainability plan
- ▶ Manages the **FCS Advisory Council**



2018 and beyond

Initiative 1

- Implementation of ACH project plans (due October)
- Tribal project proposals led by American Indian Health Commission (due August)

Initiative 2

- Continuing Long-term Services & Supports

Initiative 3

- Ramping up Foundational Community Supports with more beneficiaries, providers and regions

Integration

- Requirement to have all regions integrated by 2020
- Transformation funding is contingent on that goal

New addition

- Substance Use Disorder (SUD) amendment to allow expanded access to inpatient & residential treatment
