## Purpose:

This policy clarifies which documents the School Employees Benefits Board (SEBB) Program considers valid for establishing state residency for school employees who are in a legal union, other than marriage as defined in RCW 26.04.260.

## Policy:

- 1. Effective January 1, 2020, the SEBB Program requires subscribers with a legal union from another state to provide documents to verify their state residency.
- 2. Based on RCW 26.04.260 the partner or spouse of a legal union from another state will only be eligible for SEBB benefits for one year after becoming a permanent resident of Washington State. The partner or spouse would lose their eligibility for SEBB benefits if a marriage does not occur before the end of that one year.
- 3. Table 33-1 shows a list of valid documents the SEBB Program will use to establish state residency.
