Statutes authorizing the agency to adopt rules on this subject: RCW 41.05.021, 41.05.160, and 74.09.565 Reasons why rules on this subject may be needed and what they might accomplish: The agency is revising this rule to conform with Section 1924 of the Social Security Act, which does not allow Medicaid agencies to deem income from an institutional spouse to an institutional spouse when determining eligibility for long-term services and supports.
