1	1.5 Minimum Qualifications	How are you defining peer-run organization in relation to this RFQQ and the Division of Behavioral Health & Recovery (p. 6 under minimum qualifications)?	Peer-run organizations are service providers owned, operated and administrated by persons with lived experiences of mental health and/or substance use disorders.
2	1.6 Funding	Is this Federal Passthrough money, or state money?	The subsequent contract is funded by federal passthrough funds
3	1.4 Objectives and Scope of Work	How many behavioral health Ombuds would be needing trained for any given two day training event?	Anticipate up to 17 for in person trainings, and up to 25 for virtual trainings

4	1.4 Objectives and Scope of Work	Is there a specific physical geographic location or city you are hoping the trainings will take place (Eastern Washington, Western Washington, Spokane, Seattle, etc.)	Trainings will begin virtually, but if a training is in person Thurston County is the anticipated location as noted in Exhibit F, Draft Sample Contract Including General Terms and Conditions (GT&Cs) and Statement of Work
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
