

# Anyone can respond to an overdose

## Carry naloxone! Save a life!

### Where can I find naloxone?

Check out the naloxone map at the [StopOverdose.org](https://stopoverdose.org) website.

- **Syringe exchange and community programs** distribute naloxone, often only to their clients.
- Your **health care** provider can write you a prescription that you can pick up at a pharmacy.
- Under the WA Statewide Standing Order, **pharmacies** can dispense naloxone. Like getting a flu shot, you can get naloxone without seeing a prescriber first, and have your insurance charged.

### Tips

- Before you go, call to find out about availability, cost, and insurance coverage. If you have Medicaid there is no copay. Private insurance coverage will vary.
- If you have any issues getting naloxone at a pharmacy, ask for the pharmacy manager.
- If your pharmacy delivers, naloxone can be sent to your house, just like with other medications.
- Find resources at the [StopOverdose.org](https://stopoverdose.org) website and learn to save a life.

### Encourage adults to talk with the kids in their life about opioid overdose

Adults can educate older children about how to respond to an overdose. Whether it is a loved one, or coming to the aid of a stranger everyone can save a life. Talking through an action plan can help adults and kids feel safe, empowered and prepared.
