The CDR is now open for provider testing!

In collaboration with the state health information exchange, OneHealthPort (OHP), HCA has continued preparations for the CDR rollout early next year. Recently, we have reached some key milestones:

- OneHealthPort has completed work on technical changes to allow some different options for providers to submit their care summaries and to match the clinical data to the correct patient in the CDR.
- The CDR test domain is open for providers to begin submitting their clinical summaries in a standard electronic format called a Continuity of Care Document (CCD). These care summaries will be submitted after each outpatient encounter or inpatient admission.

Providers who will be required to submit CCD files for their Apple Health Managed Care enrollees by February 1, 2017 should contact OneHealthPort as soon as possible to begin technical readiness work.

Other activities that have continued during November include:

- A webinar summarizing the work of an interagency Privacy Workgroup around sharing data via the health information exchange
- Continued webinars and meetings with various stakeholder groups
- Continued planning for CDR reports
- Planning for early CDR training
- Meetings with managed care organizations to review progress and next steps

- Completing a statewide roadshow with Indian Health Care Services to discuss the CDR and the Meaningful Use incentive payment program.

OneHealthPort is offering monthly webinars for EHR vendor and provider organizations. Their readiness efforts are continuing in parallel with those of the state. HCA is also participating in those webinars to address any policy and requirement questions. The links below contain more information.

OHP Subscription Fee, Certified EHRs, and the CDR

We have been receiving many questions regarding the OHP annual subscription fee, whether or not EHRs are certified, and the upcoming CDR deadline - we want to take a moment to address these.

The OHP annual subscription fee is required to be a part of the HIE. This fee covers all services, if you already have an active subscription there is no additional cost. If your organization doesn't have a subscription you will be required to purchase one. It is on a sliding scale dependent upon your annual net patient revenue.

How Much Does it Cost?

Provider organizations that participate in the CDR must join the OneHealthPort HIE to establish a trust framework and securely exchange information. The cost to the provider organization to join the HIE is an annual subscription fee based on the organization's annual net patient revenue. The CDR leverages the standards already present in certified EHRs. EHR vendors' readiness to output a C-CDA may vary. Providers should confirm what, if any, additional fees their EHR vendors may charge.

Organization Level	Annual Net Patient Revenue	Annual Subscription Fee
Entry	\$0 - \$10 Million	\$600
Small	\$10 Million - \$100 Million	\$6,000
Mid-size	\$100 Million - \$500 Million	\$12,000
Large	\$500 Million - \$1 Billion	\$24,000
Leadership	\$1 Billion Plus	\$48,000

The cost of the CDR itself is covered by the Health Care Authority, Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services, and the Managed Care Organizations. There is no cost to the provider organization.

90-Day Rule

CMS is finalizing a 90-day EHR reporting period in 2016 and 2017 for all returning EPs, eligible hospitals and CAHs that have previously demonstrated meaningful use in the Medicare and Medicaid EHR Incentive Programs. CMS is extending the 90-day EHR reporting period to include 2017 in response to stakeholder comments indicating concerns with implementing API functionalities for Stage 3, program and systems changes in 2017, as well as to allow eligible clinicians time to transition to the Merit-based Incentive Payment System (MIPS), and to provide flexibility for all health care providers that are preparing for Stage 3 and the implementation of 2015 Edition Certified EHR technology (CEHRT). The EHR reporting period will be any continuous 90-day period between January 1st and December 31st in CY 2016 and CY 2017.

Possible Addition of Provider Type Eligibility

Washington State is currently pursuing a State Plan Amendment adding Optometrists and Podiatrists and eligible EHR providers. We will keep you updated as the process moves forward.
