## **Additional Resources**

The Indian Health Improvement Act, RCW 43.71B, charges the Advisory Council to:

- Meet at least three times every year when the legislature is not in session.
- Adopt a biennial Indian health advisory plan, developed by the reinvestment committee.
- Address issues with tribal implications that are not able to be resolved at the agency level.
- Establish the Indian health reinvestment account to provide incentives for tribes to assume the administrative burdens created by the federal requirements for the state to shift health care costs to the federal government.
- Provide oversight of contracting and performance of service coordination or contracting
  entities to address their impacts on services to American Indians and Alaska Natives and
  relationships with Indian health care provider.
- Provide oversight of the Indian health improvement reinvestment account, ensuring amounts expended are consistent with the adopted Indian health advisory plan.
- Draft recommended legislation to address Indian health improvement needs including, but not limited to, crisis coordination between Indian health care providers and the state's behavioral health system.
