Why wait to get paid??

Provider Attestation Record-Keeping Reminder:

CMS and HCA cannot emphasize enough, the importance of saving all supporting documents used for attestation. The most accurate data reflecting the attestation is best saved **at the time of attestation and submission**. These may be reports, screenshots, and patient lists. During the course of an audit, providers must be able to provide documentation to support their attestations as submitted. We want you to be successful. Providers who wait until they are audited to try to recreate or recover documentation are putting themselves through unnecessary work, time, and expense. Additionally, recreated reports and patient lists sometimes provide inaccurate information.

Remember to keep an electronic back-up or file of all documentation/reports used during each attestation. This will save you considerable time and efforts if you are ever asked to provide attestation materials during an audit.

Auditors **may** request screenshots or reports for the reporting period that support the attestations. The auditor may further request patient lists to support the reports submitted for each objective that requires a numerator and denominator. In the end, it is far simpler for a provider to go to an electronic file and upload the document to eMIPP rather than having to try to re-create the documentation.

To simplify and support this requirement the Health Care Authority now requests encounter reports at the time of attestation. The reports should be in Excel format (for ease of sorting and review) and include at a minimum:

- Patient names, date of services, servicing NPI, insurance carrier, client ID/insurance number (Identify the encounters that are Apple Health/Medicaid or otherwise includable in the 30% patient volume requirement, as opposed to other types of coverage) and;
- A list of providers included in the encounter data, including Name/NPI/License Type/Date of Hire and End Date. When using group proxy, the entire practice must be included, including non-EP's and;
- If multiple Organizations (group proxy) the name of each clinic or how the orgs are organized (specialty, location, license type, etc.).

Please contact us directly through the HealthIT@hca.wa.gov email for questions or assistance with this report. We provide individual assistance as needed to support your attestation.

Right now, prior to any rule changes that CMS might make for 2015 attestations, we are working under the 2014 rule. If you are attesting to AIU or MU Stage 1-Year 1 please attest as soon as you have collected 90-days of data!

While we do expect changes to the current rule to be effective as of the date of final publication, it will take time to update the eMIPP attestation system with those changes. The Health Care Authority is reviewing the proposed rules and depending on the extent of program changes, attestations may need to be suspended pending technical and process updates. Waiting could delay your payment as far out as 2016. Don't wait until everyone else tries to attest ...be the early bird!
