


Single Bed Certification Quarterly Update
May 2016

A single bed certification permits a person to be detained under the mental health Involuntary Treatment Act (ITA) and temporarily receive services from a licensed facility that is not currently certified to treat involuntary clients under WAC 388-865-0500. When someone is detained, they must be placed in a certified evaluation and treatment (E&T) bed or a bed certified under the single bed certification process. Single bed certifications require that the facility be willing and able to provide timely and appropriate mental health treatment.



In the past six month period 77% of single bed certifications are authorized in hospitals with a Psychiatric Unit, a Psychiatric Hospital, or a general Hospital that is willing and able to provide directly, or by direct arrangement, timely and appropriate mental health treatment. Partnership with community hospitals can provide coordinated care locally where the consumer resides. The number of hospitals that are willing and able to provide appropriate mental health services have increased since December 2014 from 36 to 62. In the quarter January 2016 through March 2016, 16.5% of single bed certifications were requested for a person who was expected to be discharged within 30 days and being at a community mental health facility would facilitate continuity of care. Single bed certification requests for medical services not generally available at an evaluation and treatment facility was an average of 2.5% for the period of October 2015 to March 2016.


Investigations and 72 Hour Holds

Designated Mental Health Professionals conduct investigations and evaluations which may result in the detention of a person if they meet the criteria for being involuntarily detained. "Detention" or "detain" means the lawful confinement of a person, under the provisions of RCW 71.05. For the full description and definitions see, [See RCW 71.05](#)

An investigation occurs when a designated mental health professional receives information alleging that a person, as a result of a mental disorder presents a likelihood of serious harm or is gravely disabled. The designated mental health professional may, after investigation and evaluation file a petition for initial detention. Before filing the petition, the designated mental health professional must personally interview the person, and determine whether the person will voluntarily receive appropriate evaluation and treatment.
