Getting help with health care coverage

Enrolling in health care coverage can be difficult, but there are several options for one-on-one assistance. This fact sheet lists the different types of enrollment specialists who are trained to help residents find their way to health care coverage through the Washington Healthplanfinder™ application portal. These trusted messengers are trained to help individuals manage their health care coverage, including Apple Health (Medicaid).

Navigators

Navigators provide personalized in-person assistance to consumers who need support learning about and applying for Apple Health and other health care coverage. The Washington Health Benefit Exchange (the Exchange) trains navigators to enter information into Washington Healthplanfinder™, find out more about Apple Health, and review insurance plans.

Assisters

Assisters are volunteers affiliated with a community-based organization who help individuals in their community enroll in Apple Health through Washington Healthplanfinder™. Assisters are required to pass a Health Care Authority (HCA) seven-part training in Apple Health eligibility and how to process applications in Washington Healthplanfinder™ prior to working directly with clients.

Ambassadors – coming soon

Volunteers who will help their community understand changes coming to Apple Health coverage and what actions they need to take. Ambassadors can be providers, health care facilities, community leaders, or any trusted community partner. HCA will provide ambassadors with tools to help reach their community or patients wherever they may engage the delivery system. Ambassadors do not have to participate in formal training and cannot assist with enrollment. [Sign up for email updates](#) to stay up to date on this new program.

Community-based eligibility specialists

HCA Medical assistance specialists are in community-based facilities across the state and available to applicants, enrollees, and providers to answer questions related to eligibility rules for the family, children, pregnant individuals, and adult Apple Health programs.
