## Meeting Notes:

- Winfried & Antony greeted the group and welcome Sofia Aragon to the committee leadership team.
- The committee proposed new idea for the working equity definition making the definition broader and more inclusive.
- New definition is\*:

"Health equity exists when all people have the opportunity to attain their full health potential and no one is disadvantaged. We will proactively pursue the elimination of health inequities and preventable differences in health among groups based on socioeconomic status, source of income, gender identity, sexual orientation, race and ethnicity, tribal membership, language, immigration status, age, religion, the job they have, education, disability, housing status, the neighborhood they live in or any other socially determined circumstances," Adjusted from the Washington State Department of Health 2014-2016 Strategic Plan

\*proposed additions from the meeting are in red

- Equity definition will receive final approval over e-mail.
- Projects were introduced. Kristin explained that these projects are created to help us make meaningful and measurable change within health system transformation.
- Committee members will break into the four proposed groups based on their preference

- Committee members are allowed to form other project groups, but the groups identified by HCA are the ones that have staffing capacity and subject matter experts on board.
- All projects will aim to help increase community inclusion and equity. Projects will be measurable and those metrics will be decided on within project groups.
- Suzanne Swadener (Suzanne.swadener@hca.wa.gov) introduced the topic of workforce development.
  - The workforce project will focus on Domain 1 of the Medicaid Transformation Demonstration including working with ACHs and Tribes on jobs, skills, training and education
  - The group will talk about the role of equity in the new and existing workforce
  - There is potential to work with the Practice Transformation Hub and higher ed institutes
- Kristin (Kristin.villas@hca.wa.gov) introducted the data disaggregation project
  - o The project will focus on disaggregating data that MCOs collect on race and ethnicity

- Katharine (<u>Katharine.weiss@hca.wa.gov</u>) introduced the project of ACH support on health equity and community engagement
  - The ACH project will support ACHs in the pursuit of health equity and community engagement.
  - There is an eagerness to work on health equity by ACHs but they don't feel like they have the resources and the time
  - The project team could help in the development of toolkits and other supports for ACHs to use to help measure and emphasize equity
  - There was a concern raised that there is not enough emphaisis on community. It was agreed that it is important that during this work we are engaging the community and getting community input.
  - A request was made to increase transparency around this work.
  - A debate took place over the desire to increase mandates on ACHs around community engagement and equity.
- Jon Brumbach (jon.brumbach@hca.wa.gov) will serve at the subject matter expert for work on Foundational Community Supports under Intitiative 3.
- Meeting time ran out and committee agreed that next steps will take place over e-mail.
- Committee members were encouraged to send in their project preferences to Katharine and Kristin.
- The next full committee meeting will take place in December.
- Project groups will set up regular meetings in the next month. Project leads will reach out to members interested in their project.
