What are behavioral health treatment provider relief funds?

- Provider Relief funds were provided to the Health Care Authority to address behavioral health treatment access resulting from
 - Workforce shortages
 - The COVID-19 public health emergency
- Funds were provided to HCA in the 2022 supplemental community behavioral health budget <u>ESSB 5693 Section 215(104)</u>
- Funds will be lump sum payments to eligible community behavioral health treatment providers dispersed before October 1, 2022



Eligible uses of funds

What can the funds be used for?

- Immediate workforce retention and recruitment
- Childcare stipends
- Student loan repayment
- Tuition assistance
- Relocation expenses
- Other workforce recruitment efforts
- Costs incurred due to the COVID-19 public health emergency
- Funds are eligible to be used for costs incurred prior to July 1, 2022 but must be used for costs incurred after March 3, 2021
- Providers must agree to expend the funds by June 30, 2023



Eligible Behavioral Health Treatment Providers Include:

Community Behavioral Health treatment providers who are:

- Non-hospital-based
- Contracted and receiving payment through a Managed Care Organization (MCO) or a Behavioral Health Administrative Service Organization (BHASO)
- Licensed as a BHA to provide:
 - Withdrawal management and secure withdrawal management
 - Residential and 24/7 treatment providers providing, substance use disorder (SUD), mental health (MH), and cooccurring services
 - Outpatient treatment providers providing, SUD, MH, and co-occurring services Evaluation and treatment (E&T) Centers
 - Crisis stabilization, crisis triage, and mobile crisis providers



Ineligible Behavioral Health Providers Include:

- Hospital based behavioral health services
- Substance use disorder Prevention and mental health promotion community wellness services
- Children's Long-term Inpatient (CLIP)
- Problem Gambling services and supports

- Recovery Support Services including:
 - supportive housing
 - supportive employment
 - recovery cafés
 - other non-treatment recovery services



Payment Methodologies

- Payments will be determined based on the number of people served by eligible providers during six months of 2019 and six months of 2021.
- Client counts will be estimated based on claims from ProviderOne
- HCA will use these reviews to determine the most equitable distribution methodologies for these payments.



Two-step Process to Receive Funds

July: Opt-in request form to gather agencies signatory information

Action: two-week response required

August: Contract containing amount of funds to be received and funding requirements

Action: Time limited response required

Payments to Behavioral Health Providers prior to September 30, 2022
