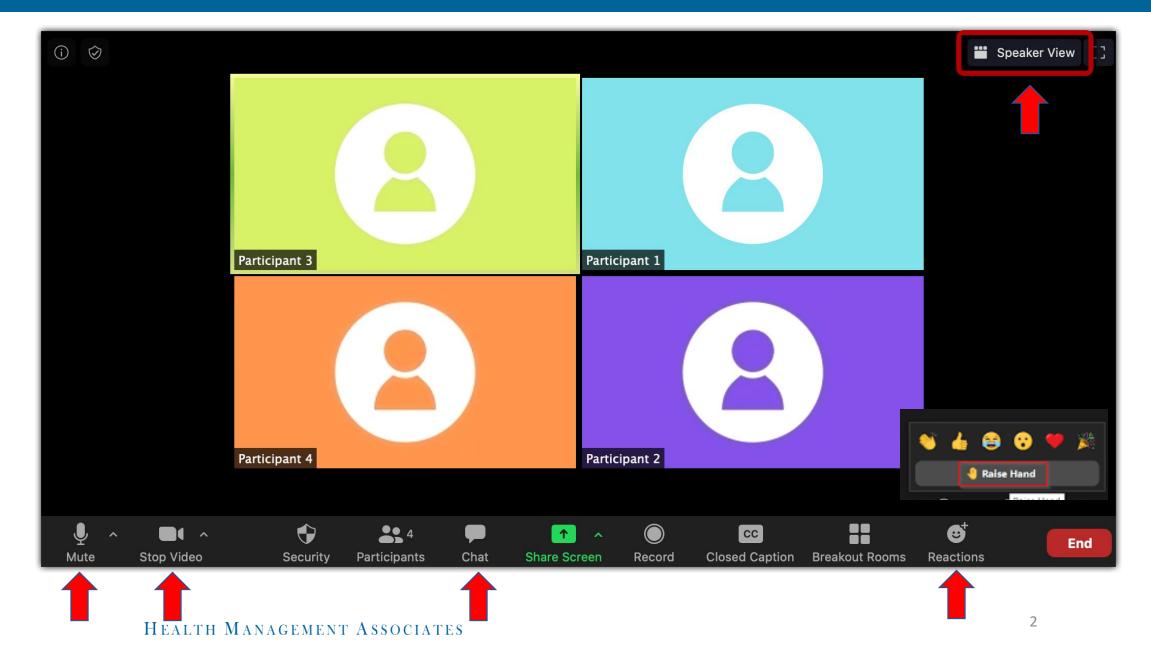

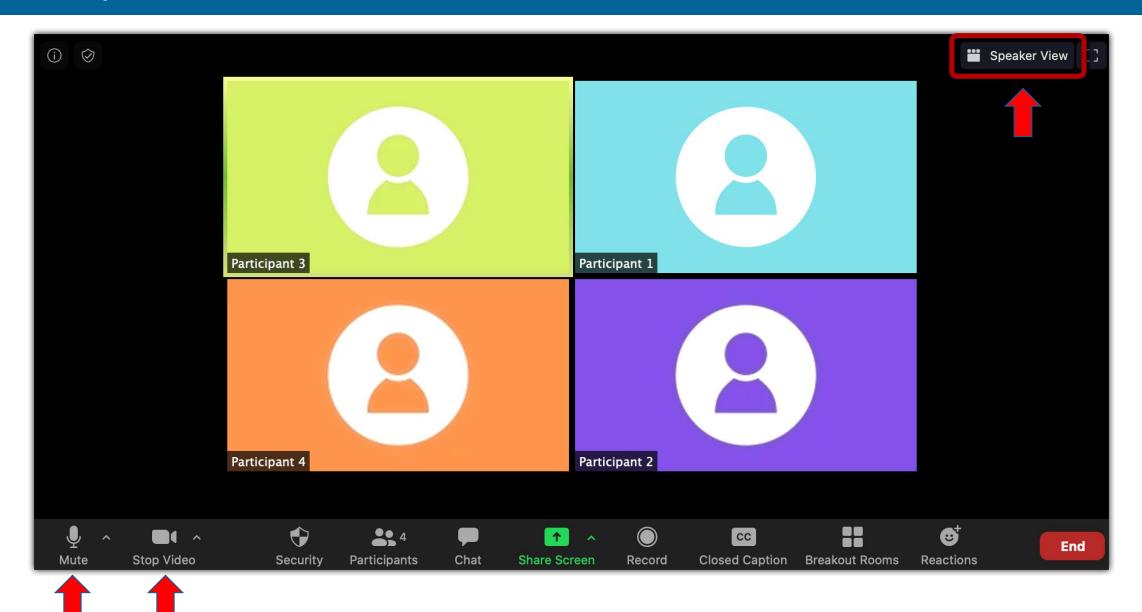

CRIMINAL JUSTICE SYSTEM (CJS) and EMERGENCY DEPARTMENTS (EDs) are functioning as primary access points to behavioral health (BH) care, leading to worse BH outcomes for people. This needs to be mitigated by establishing protocols to divert people from EDs and the CJS to community-based BH care.

When released from the CJS, people have a hard time transitioning to care within the community, which may precipitate a BH crisis that could lead them back into the CJS. Protocols need to be established to enable a smooth transition for them.

QUOTES FROM LIVED EXPERIENCE

*** "My first stay in prison was devastating to my psyche, I found myself in a world of which I knew nothing about. The fear and depression was contagious it permeated every single day of my experience. Which I believe became the catalyst for the subsequent drug abuse and mental health problems."

*** "The major problem people such as myself face upon reentry into their environment. Is the lack of fundamental resources to help you rebuild your life"

*** "My passion is number one stopping people before they go into the carceral system through trauma services, through behavioral health services, prevention at the school, in the schools providing community for these children to have somebody safe, to be even go to.

*** "We incarcerate more from rural America than anywhere else."
