Discussion Summary

Exploring Legislative Session for 2026

Renee Fullerton and Hugh Ewart (Workforce and Rates Subgroup Leads) shared an update and led the discussion on this year's legislative session preparation.

- 1. Washington Thriving Strategic Plan Update
 - a. A summarized version of the Strategic plan is now public, the Washington Thriving team welcomes feedback via a survey with a due date of September 15th
 - b. Link to survey was shared in chat for additional input.
- 2. Budget Context for this year's Legislative session
 - a. There is potentially a \$2 billion revenue shortfall anticipated for the state.
 - b. Legislative recommendations must be no to low budget impact in order to be considered
 - c. There is a focus on protecting existing programs rather than new funding requests



- 3. New concept presented: Regarding the UW Applied Child & Adolescent Psychology Graduate Program, a faculty member highlighted that not all graduate programs that qualify for licensure as a mental health counselor are accredited in the same way. The state should be flexible rather than relying solely on a single accreditor.
 - a. The UW Applied Child & Adolescent Psychology Graduate Program is not a part of CACREP (CACREP is the Council on Accreditation for Counseling and Education-Related Programs) because it was created to help individuals reach mental health counselor licensure (LMHC) in Washington quickly to speed workforce entry and reduce costs to students.
 - There is a disparity in the rules for the LMHC profession between CACREP and non-CACREP programs. CACREP programs receive 500-hour practicum credit toward LMHC post graduate supervision requirements; non-CACREP programs do not
 - b. Scholarship eligibility barriers for students in non-CACREP programs
 - c. Request to reduce distinctions that create barriers for qualified LMHCs.
- 4. Conditional Scholarship Program Updates
 - a. Washington State Behavioral Health Workforce Development Initiative (WDI) is transitioning administration from UW School of Social Work to Washington Student Achievement Council
 - b. \$25 million original funding plus \$4.5 million additional for Fall 2025
 - i. Focus shifting to advanced skills training and systems change
 - ii. 145 new scholarships allocated for school social work programs
 - iii. 31 WSAC scholarships awarded for Fall 2025
- 5. Legacy Item Status Updates
 - a. PAL (Partnership Access Line), FAST training program and Referral Assist team restoration is being considered as an overarching recommendation
 - i. Total restoration cost: Approximately \$1 million annually
 - ii. State general fund portion: Only 17% (~\$170,000)
 - iii. Current service reductions: Hours cut from 8-5 to 9-4
 - b. Conditional Scholarship Skills Training and Evaluation
 - i. A recommendation is being developed by Vaughnetta Barton with Workforce Development Initiative
 - c. Teaching Clinic Rate Large fiscal note is anticipated for a recommendation, the leads are exploring socialization opportunities with Representative Callan.
 - d. CCBHC (Certified Community Behavioral Health Centers) Implementation Ongoing efforts through Healthcare Authority and Behavioral Health Council and likely does not need a recommendation from W&R for this legislative session.
- 6. Possible Policy Priority: Licensing and Credentialing Delays
 - a. Department of Health licensing delays have been identified as top workforce barrier
 - b. Co-leads, Renee and Hugh, are planning a meeting with DOH leadership to learn how the W&R Subgroup may be able to provide a recommendation to help reduce the wait times for professional licenses and certifications.



Next steps

- 1. W&R will be sharing emerging legislative recommendations at the next Children and Youth Behavioral Work Group (CYBHWG) meeting on September 18th. The Subgroup will make final decisions regarding recommendation submissions at the next Subgroup meeting on September 24th.
- 2. Final submissions of Legislative Recommendations to CYBHWG are due on October 6th, 2025.
