If not, why not? • For CCORS: why do you think such a small percentage of calls to Crisis Connections are referred to your team? (e.g. Based on Crisis Connections data for south King County, out of 3,404 calls from Jan – July 2020, only 9, or 0.25% of calls were referred to the children’s crisis outreach team) • What kind of efforts have been made to make the community aware of youth mobile crisis teams as a resource?
