WSCMS Core Set Measures

Definition: The Core Set includes measures that (state purchasers), payers and providers should use in their Value-Based Purchasing (VBP) contracts (agreements).

- 1. Child and Adolescent Well-Care Visits (WCV)
- 2. Childhood Immunization Status (CIS-E) Combination 10
- 3. Breast Cancer Screening (BCS-E)
- 4. Colorectal Cancer Screening (COL-E)
- 5. Depression Remission or Response for Adolescents and Adults (DRR-E)
- 6. Follow-Up After ED Visit for Substance Use (FUA)
- 7. Follow-Up After Hospitalization for Mental Illness (FUH)
- 8. Controlling High Blood Pressure (CBP)
- 9. Glycemic Status Assessment for Patients with Diabetes (GSD)
- 10. Prenatal/Postpartum Care (PPC)

WSCMS Supplementary Measures

Definition: Additional measures from which payers and providers may choose to supplement the Core measures in their Value-Based Purchasing contracts (agreements).

- 1. Immunizations for Adolescents (IMA)
- 2. Well Child Visits in the First Thirty Months of Life (W30)
- 3. Adult Immunization Status (AIS-E)
- 4. Cervical Cancer Screening (CCS)
- 5. Chlamydia Screening (CHL)
- 6. Depression Screening and Follow Up for Adolescents and Adults (DSF-E)
- 7. Follow-up After Emergency Department Visit for Mental Illness (FUM)
- 8. Follow-Up Care for Children prescribed ADHD Medication (ADD-E)
- 9. Eye Exam for Patients with Diabetes (EED)
- 10. Kidney Health Evaluation for Patients with Diabetes (KED)
- 11. Member Experience: HP-CAHPS Health Plan Survey Composite How Well Providers Communicate with Patients
- 12. Statin Therapy for Patients with Cardiovascular Disease (SPC)
- 13. Cesarean Birth (NTSV C-Section) (Hospital) (SDP)

WSCMS Legislatively Mandated Measures

Definition: Measures that are legislatively mandated to be included in the WSCMS.

- 1. Arrest Rate for Medicaid Beneficiaries with an Identified Behavioral Health Need
- 2. Timely Receipt of Substance Use Disorder Treatment for Medicaid Beneficiaries Released from a Correctional Facility
- 3. Timely Receipt of Mental Health Treatment for Medicaid Beneficiaries Released from a Correctional Facility
- 4. Homelessness (Broad and Narrow) (HOME-B and HOME-N)
