## SUBJECT: New Youth Toolkit materials added to the "For Our Lives" website

In accordance with chapter 43.376 RCW and the Washington State Centennial Accord of 1989, regarding collaboration with Indian tribes in the development of policies, agreements, and program implementation that directly affect Indian tribes and the Tribal Consultation and Communication Policy of the Health Care Authority (HCA), the HCA shares the following update.

## **New Youth Toolkit Materials**

For Our Lives is an educational health campaign that informs and educates Tribal communities about opioid misuse prevention, overdose response, and treatment. Over the last year, HCA and campaign contractor, Desautel Hege (DH), have worked closely with Tribes across the state to share For Our Lives materials and localize/customize messaging specific to each Tribe.

During the 2023 Centennial Accord and Tribal-State Behavioral Health and Fentanyl/Opioid Campaign Workgroup meeting, Tribal leaders asked HCA to expand campaign messaging to include Native youth and create youth-specific materials. Workgroup members expressed the urgency and how quickly youth-specific materials are created.

In efforts to expand the campaign, new materials have been developed and added to the toolkit page of the For Our Lives website <u>here</u>. The new materials (as well as some existing materials that are age appropriate for young people) have been added to both the "youth" and "all" filters of the toolkit. The full youth extension of the campaign will be launched in 2025, including a more robust set of toolkit materials created specifically for Native youth. - A list of organizations in Washington state which specifically serve Native youth (i.e. UNEA, Native Project, Healing Lodge, Rise Above, etc.) as well as Urban Indian Health Programs
