A Personal Story from Regional Tri-Leads Regional FYSPRT Tri-Leads	<p>Topic Purpose – to hear from Tri-leads who have experienced homelessness and/or worked close with those who have and share what resources were helpful</p> Regional FYSPRT Tri-leads from two different Regional FYSPRTs shared their story about experiencing homelessness and the resources that have been helpful for them. Some helpful resources included the Union Gospel Mission, Salvation Army, drop-in centers and a call in line to connect to resources. It was noted that some resources provided on the call in line have a waiting list. One tri-lead also identified the importance of preventative programs vs resources being for when homelessness is being experienced. Participants are interested in having more information from the Office of Homeless Youth (OHY) about grant opportunities and what the application process looks like. In addition, other changes with state agencies occurred on 7/1/18 including Children’s Administration becoming a part of the new Department of Children Youth and Families. The plan for the Children’s Behavioral Health Executive Leadership Team (CBH ELT) is to add new membership to reflect the changes in state agencies and incorporate youth and family voice into the meetings and process. Invites to the following will be extended: the DBHR Family Liaison, DBHR Youth Liaison, the Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction and Department of Health, the Department of Children Youth and Families, Developmental Disabilities Administration and Rehabilitation Administration. A total of 30 questions were submitted, of which 5 were answered at the May meeting. <p>Social Emotional Learning Modules</p> <p>Ron Hertel</p>	<p>Topic Purpose – information sharing about Social Emotional Learning as a process by which individuals build awareness and skills in managing emotions, setting goals, establishing relationships, and making responsible decisions that support success in school and in life. <i>(This topic was requested by a Statewide FYSPRT member in early 2018)</i></p> <p>Ron Hertel from the Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction, presented about Social Emotional Learning (SEL) Modules which were released statewide in 2017. Washington’s specific standards and benchmarks include self-awareness, self-management, self-efficacy, social awareness, social management, and social engagement.
