SUBJECT: Health Innovation Leadership Network 2017 Activities

We are privileged to welcome a new leader to the Health Innovation Leadership Network (HILN). Bill Robertson, President and Chief Executive Officer of MultiCare Health System, joins us as the HILN co-chair replacing Rick Cooper. Bill brings a wealth of health systems transformation experience both as a dedicated community leader and a health systems executive.

Over the last two years, the Healthier Washington initiative has relied on the HILN to serve as the key statewide leadership forum to communicate the work of Healthier Washington, as well as to accelerate the adoption of Healthier Washington efforts. Together, we have forged the path to change the way we are paying for care in many communities, ensuring that providers are supported in achieving improved cost and quality performance. Providers, payers, and community leaders have come together to integrate the financing and delivery of physical and behavioral health services to achieve health for the whole person. Community organizations have come together in new ways, demonstrating that bridging health care and social health can move the needle toward the interrelated three-part aim of better care, lower costs, and healthier people. Along the way, [we've told stories](#) about these innovative activities happening across Washington State.

Now, mid-way through the Healthier Washington federal grant and with the launch of the Medicaid Transformation Demonstration, HILN has the opportunity to focus in an even more concerted way on spreading and sustaining the Healthier Washington strategies and vision.

A key lever in sustaining and spreading these successes will be on-going HILN leadership committed to value-based purchasing of health services. Specifically, HILN can support an action agenda this year to achieve Washington State's goal of 30 percent value-based payment in state-financed contracts by the conclusion of 2017 and progress toward the goal of 50 percent value-based payment in the commercial market by 2019. This can be achieved through continuing to leverage value-based purchasing contracts, using the common measure set to document improvement, adopting evidence-based clinical practices, applying an equity lens to our reform efforts, supporting providers in the transition to value, and ensuring social health sectors are part of delivery system transformation. Working through our shared public and private leadership networks we can encourage value-based purchasing, ensuring people and their families are at the center of our efforts. We envision providing a forum through HILN to make existing efforts more visible, ensure partnerships are spreading effective improvements and

inspiring new efforts, by investing in the systems that will ensure that a healthier Washington endures.

In keeping with this focus for the next several months, we have arranged the following schedule of HILN meetings:

- *A virtual meeting on May 5 from 10 a.m. to noon* to specify our HILN actions for the upcoming months. In order for us to prepare for this webinar, please expect some questions to arrive via email in the coming weeks.
- *A quarterly meeting on July 14 from 9 a.m. to noon* at Cambia Grove in Seattle to report on progress for our plan, and HILN support that may be needed to further our efforts.
- *Healthier Washington Symposium: Our Commitment to Value, on October 18 and 19* in SeaTac. This two day symposium will focus on both value-based purchasing and HILN's broader triple aim objectives.
- *A quarterly meeting on January 19, 2018 from 9 a.m. to noon* at Cambia Grove in Seattle to celebrate our accomplishments and identify next steps.

We are very much looking forward to your active participation over the coming months. Thank you for your leadership and engagement as we work together toward a healthier Washington.
