Washington State Problem Gambling Program


- Dept. of Health responsible for certifying agencies that provide treatment (agencies must already have substance use disorder certification)
- HCA delegated certification of problem gambling counselors to Evergreen Council on Problem Gambling
 - HCA also funds Problem Gambling Counselor Certification program (in addition to outreach and prevention activities)
- HCA contracts with certified treatment providers/organizations to provide problem gambling outpatient treatment services



Funding

Biennium 2017-2019 funding = approx. \$1,449,000

Washington State Problem Gambling Program Budget



State--Outpatient Tx Contracts (68.5%)

■ ECPG--Training, Outreach, Prevention (14.5%)

State -- Admin/other (17%)



Treatment

- Treatment provided to individuals and/or family members who are assessed as needing treatment and cannot afford to pay
 - Clients do not need to be Medicaid eligible
- Covered outpatient services include:
 - Assessments
 - ► Individual counseling
 - Group counseling
 - Family counseling
 - Case management



Treatment

- > HCA contracts with 23 provider agencies/individuals
- 175 individuals in treatment (as of Nov. 2018)
 - ▶ Over 50% female
 - ▶ 72% age 40 or older
 - ▶ 93% of those served are in Western Washington



Strengths and needs

Strengths

- Regular funding stream (established by RCW)
- Dedicated partners, including Washington State Gambling Commission and Evergreen Council of Problem Gambling

Needs

- ► Gap in number of problem gambling treatment providers in Eastern Washington
- ▶ Better prevalence data on adolescents and adults
