MOUD patient rights complaint form



Patients that take Medications for Opioid Use Disorder (MOUD) should be treated like anyone else when being admitted and cared for in medical and treatment settings. When patients are not, the facility might be violating WACs, Washington Law Against Discrimination (WLAD), and/or Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).

When your patients experience this, we ask that you please fill out the requested information below to the best of your ability and return it to the State Opioid Treatment Authority (SOTA) office.

We take complaints about any type of treatment and medical setting including but not limited to residential treatment facilities, skilled nursing facilities, hospitals, substance use disorder outpatient treatment settings, withdrawal management facilities, carceral settings, residential settings, etc.

When the SOTA office receives the information below, a process will be initiated whereby the SOTA office will connect with the regulatory authority over that setting type, potentially the patient's Managed Care Organizations (MCO)/Medicaid, and Attorney General's Office, and other entities as necessary to resolve the complaint.
