Budget 2020

We don't know yet!

 We have every reason to believe we will be able to support the same level of programs and activities as last year, plus hopefully additional funding.







- Every year, the OCP funds several projects by consumer-run organizations.
- These grants can run from \$3,000-\$5,000.
- The projects must be for recovery educations, leadership or advocacy training, or networking opportunities (not only for peer supporters).
- They must be contracted with a state-approved entity or use one as a fiscal agent (contact jennifer.bliss@hca.wa.gov for more information)



Peer Respite Implementation



- A supplemental legislative funding request is being submitted.
- A peer advisory committee has been formed and will be meeting in August.
- NYAPRS and Steve Micchio will be providing TA and assisting with facilitation.
- A larger stakeholder group will also be formed with MCOs, BHOs, ASO, providers, etc.
