Thurston-Mason Forums

- In collaboration with Thurston-Mason NAMI and the BHO, the OCP will be holding two forums in October, on October 22 in Shelton and October 23 in Olympia
- The events will be big! They will be held from 4:30-7:30 p.m.

- Every year, the OCP funds several projects by consumer-run organizations.
- These grants can run from \$3,000-\$5,000.
- The projects must be for recovery educations, leadership or advocacy training, or networking opportunities (not only for peer supporters).
- They must be contracted with a state-approved entity or use one as a fiscal agent (contact jennifer.bliss@hca.wa.gov for more information)



Peer Respite Implementation



- Two stakeholder groups met on August 26 in Lacey, a peer group, and a larger stakeholder group. It was voted to combine these groups.
- HCA facilitators assisted and Steve Micchio from New York presented.
- A supplemental legislative funding request is being submitted.
- NYAPRS and Steve Micchio will be providing TA and assisting with group facilitation.



Rules about Peer Respites

 Washington laws, in this case, Washington Administrative Code (WACs), or rules, provide structure to the details of legislation.

 The Department of Health is working on WACs for peer respites and has held three stakeholder meetings so far. Next the final language draft will come out and there will be a public hearing.



Pulic Hearing on Respites

 At this point, the WAC language is nearly finalized just ONE opportunity left to provide your voice and advocacy.
