Meg O'Leary,	 Julia: In our recommendation "Increasing funding for the

	funding be doubled (not just increased), based on the need	
	illuminated in the Prevalence Study and other gap analyses.	
	 Roxane: It's important to note that there are other data 	
	sources that inform this State Problem Gambling Program	
	funding recommendation. The prevalence study only covers	
	the treatment needs, not adding additional prevention,	
	outreach/awareness/education, research, workforce, and

FTE needs. This State Problem Gambling Program funding
recommendation is based on looking at what other states are
doing and what our needs are in this state.
• Sen. Conway: In our recommendation <i>"Increasing funding for</i>
the State Problem Gambling Program to meet current and
<i>future need,"</i> we must explicitly say that the model does not
include Tribal funding contributions
 Ruby: Add "Prevention" to any recommendations related to
consumer protections. It's a critical piece.
 Maureen: Agreed to draft language about "Youth
Prevention" that will be added to the consumer protection
recommendation. For example, giving high school kids
information early on.
 Julia and Maureen: Agree to work together to craft a
recommendation related to therapeutic court
 Nanci: Recommends adding language about encouraging
peer counseling by former problem gamblers as another
therapy and treatment resource in addition to formal clinical
treatment
 Rep. Kloba: For the third item under the Consumer
Protections proposed strategies, asked if the PGTF would
want to include a specific recommendation about keeping
online gambling <i>illegal</i> in WA state given what we know
about how much more addictive and riskier this type of
gambling is compared to brick and mortar gambling? Rep.
Kloba also observed that some advocates suggest legalizing
online gambling as a harm reduction action because funding
could be collected for treatment and other related services if
taxed and regulated.
 Ryan: For the recommendation related to "recognizing
impacts of internet and Gaming Disorders," consider
including language about the specific issues that can impact
youth. Much of the current attention on problem gambling is
placed on adults 18 years+, yet this form of gaming and
gambling will affect youth
 Sen. Conway: In our recommendation "WA State Legislators
and stakeholders to advocate for federal funding for problem

	<i>gambling,"</i> consider adding language about formation of permanent statewide committee on problem gambling that continues beyond the PGTF, given the expansion and increase in gambling in WA
