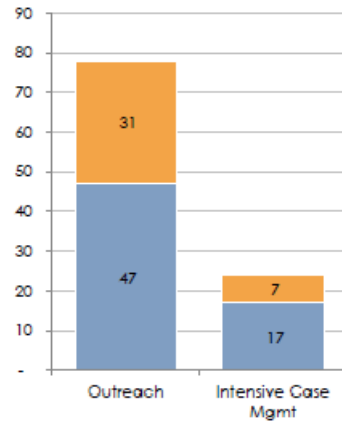

Quarter 1 + 2 | 2024

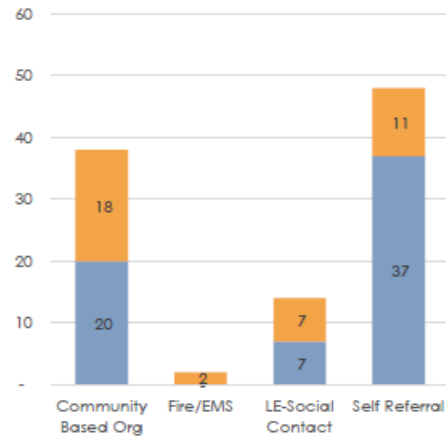
QUARTER 1 = BLUE

QUARTER 2 = GOLD

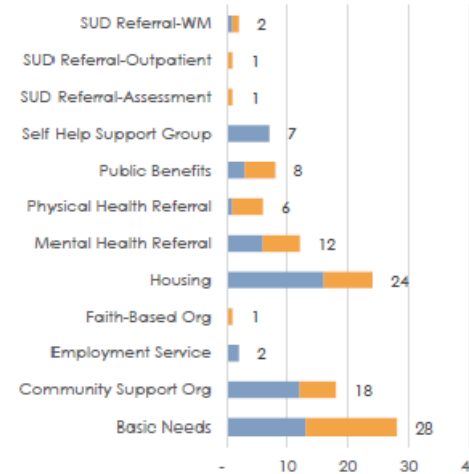
STATUS OF REFERRED INDIVIDUALS



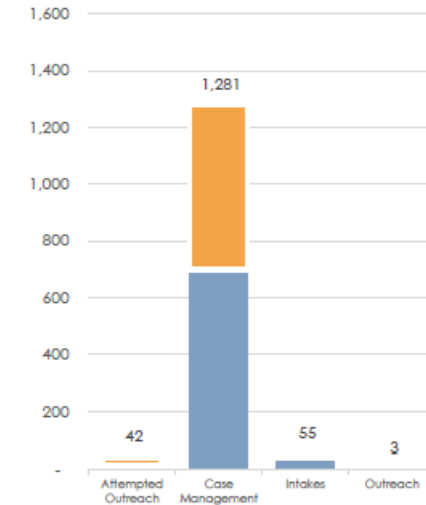

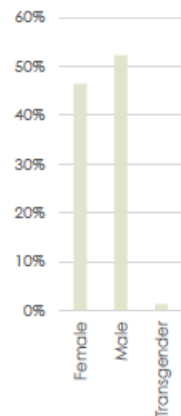


TYPE OF SERVICE PROVIDED

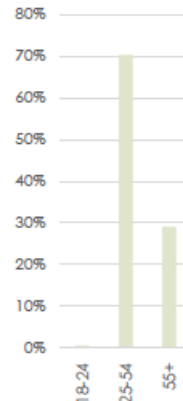

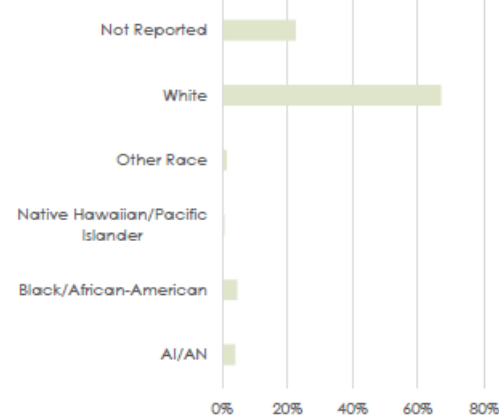

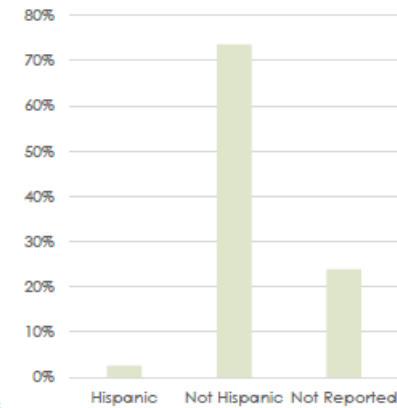
Age Group



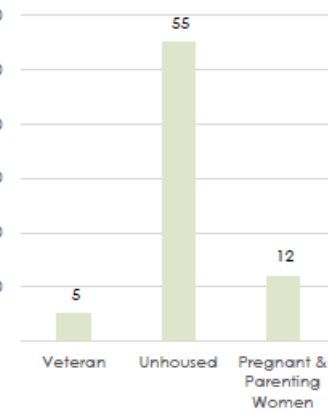

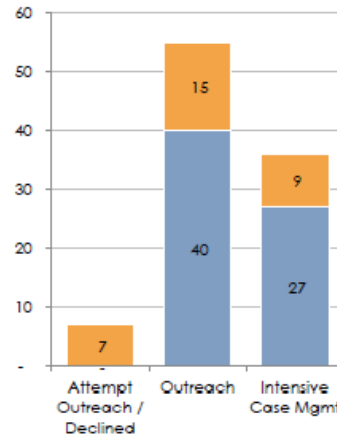

Quarter 1 + 2 | 2024

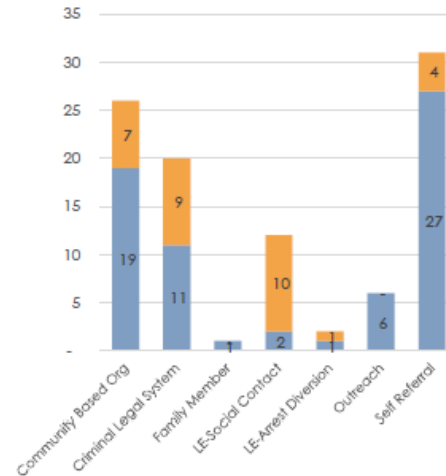
QUARTER 1 = BLUE

QUARTER 2 = GOLD

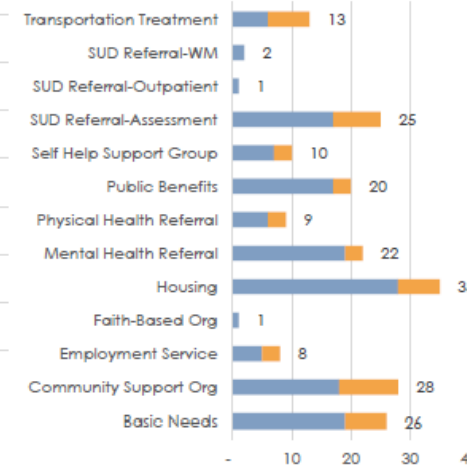
STATUS OF REFERRED INDIVIDUALS



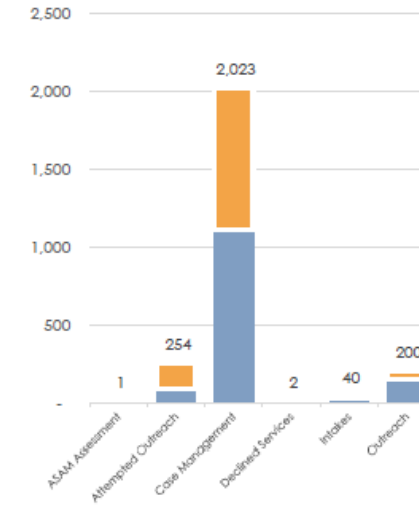

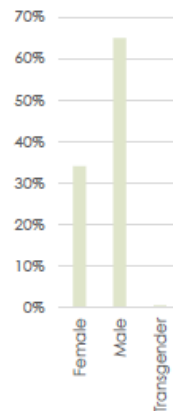


TYPE OF SERVICE PROVIDED

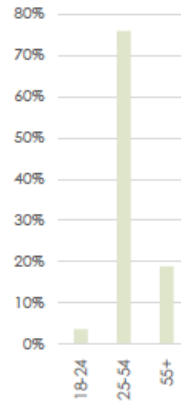

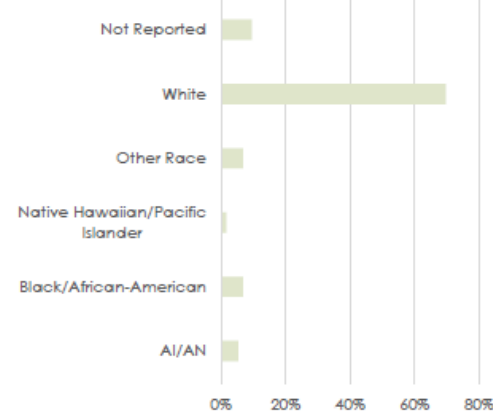

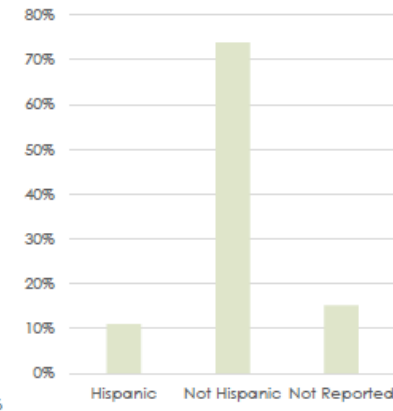
Age Group



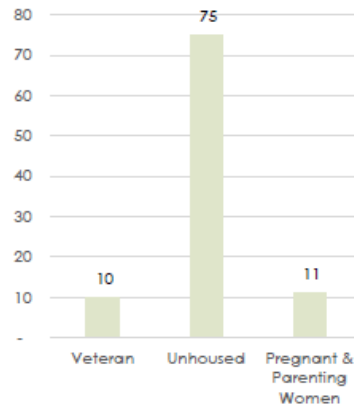
