About this Report

This report is intended for program monitoring of the State Opioid Response (SOR) Department of Correction's (DOC) Care for Offenders with Opioid Use Disorder Releasing from Prison (COORP) and Work Release (WR) program. The COORP and WR program is funded under the SOR grant through contracts with the Health Care Authority's Division of Behavioral Health and Recovery. DOC is obligated to screen a targeted number of incarcerated individuals with opioid use disorder (OUD) per month and either provide a referral for medication treatment for OUD (MOUD) upon their release date or begin MOUD prior to release. Clients also receive a naloxone kit as they are released. This report describes the demographics and enrollment trends of all persons served by the COORP program.

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UNDERSTANDING THE REPORT

Q What is DOC's COORP and WR Program?

COORP identifies persons releasing from incarceration or in the Work Release (WR) program with opioid use disorder (OUD), provides referrals to medication treatment for OUD (MOUD) programs in the community or initiate MOUD prior to release. A care navigator meets with individuals prior to their release or in WR to assess readiness for treatment. Some individuals will begin treatment prior to release. All interested individuals will receive a warm handoff to treatment providers in the community and a naloxone kit, an overdose reversal drug, upon their release.

DEFINITIONS

- **Events**
Total number of screens performed in prisons or WR. Individuals may be screened more than once and are counted as an event regardless if they enrolled in the program.
- **Clients**
Total number of unique clients screened for OUD in prisons or WR. Each client is only counted once regardless of enrollment status.
- **Enrollments**
Total number of screens where an individual enrolled in the program. Enrollment is marked by the client either starting MOUD prior to their release or receiving a referral for MOUD in the community. Individuals may be counted more than once.
- **Clients Enrolled**
Total number of unique clients that have at least one screen resulting in enrollment.
- **COORP Events**
The event trend over time. The grey area shows the total number of *Events* overall, while the blue areas show the total number of *MOUD Inductions* prior to release and *Referrals* to community MOUD providers. The blue areas are a sub-set of the grey total. The *Target* line is based on the contractual obligation of persons to serve per month (50).
- **Medication at Induction**
Of the enrollment events that resulted in MOUD prior to release, the pharmacotherapy used for induction is displayed in blue. Some referral clients in the Work Release program receive a referral that results in starting MOUD at a community provider while under DOC supervision. These induction events are displayed in grey.



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






Medication at Induction




Client Demographics



About this Report

This report is intended for program monitoring of the State Opioid Response (SOR) Department of Correction's Re-Entry Post Release program. The Re-Entry Post Release program is funded under the SOR grant through contracts with the Health Care Authority's Division of Behavioral Health and Recovery. Department of Corrections is obligated to serve a targeted number of incarcerated individuals with opioid use disorder per month, and provide the clients referrals for opioid use disorder treatment and a naloxone kit upon their release date. This report describes the demographics of all persons served by the Re-entry Post Release program and total enrollment by jail site.

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Q What is DOC's Re-entry Post Release Program?

Re-Entry Post Release identifies persons releasing from incarceration with opioid use disorder (OUD) and provides referrals to community OUD treatment programs and naloxone kits, an overdose reversal drug, as they are released. Care navigators meet with individuals prior to their release to assess readiness for treatment, make a warm handoff to community treatment providers, and follow up with the individuals post release to ensure they are receiving the care they need.

DEFINITIONS

- **Events**
Total number of program screens across sites. Individuals may be screened more than once and are counted as an event regardless if they enrolled in the program.
- **Clients**
Total number of unique clients screened for OUD at DOC site. Each client is only counted once regardless of enrollment status.
- **Enrollments**
Total number of screens where an individual enrolled in the program. Enrollment is marked by the client making a decision on the type of OUD treatment they want. Individuals may be counted more than once.
- **Clients Enrolled**
Total number of unique clients that have at least one screen resulting in enrollment.
- **Monthly Events & Enrollment**
The total number of screening events (Figure 1) are the white bar (85) and total number of screens that resulted in enrollment are the blue bar (29) for the current reporting month.
- **Enrollment Trend**
Total enrollment events over time (Figure 2) are shown in blue (13), total events are shown in the red diamond (53).
- **Percentage Enrolled Events**
The percent of all events over time that resulted in enrollment.
- **Treatment Option**
The treatment decisions made by clients for all events over time. Treatment with medication includes buprenorphine, methadone, and naltrexone. Treatment without medication would be traditional substance use disorder treatment that uses an abstinence based approach.

Monthly Events & Enrollment



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








Enrolled Client Demographics










Enrollment Trend






Enrollment Trend



Percentage Enrolled Events








Enrollment Trend

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




Enrollment Trend






Enrollment Trend



Percentage Enrolled Events








Enrollment Trend
