# Legislative Overview

### **Legislative History**

- 2020: Oregon voters passed Measure 110 (Drug Addiction Treatment and Recovery Act)
  - 1. Decriminalizes drug possession
  - 2. Creates fund from cannabis revenue for substance use services
  - 3. Creates law enforcement citation and referral process
  - 4. Establishes the Oversight and Accountability Council
  - 5. Services for communities most impacted by the war on drugs
- 2021: Senate Bill 722 established the Behavioral Health Resource Networks (BHRN)
  - BHRNs are groups of providers that can use cannabis tax funds to provide free screening, assessment, treatment, housing, peers, employment support, and harm reduction.

### Legislative History continued

- 2023: House Bill 2513 further clarified the roles of BHRNs and the OAC
- 2024: House Bill 4002
  - 1. Recriminalized drug possession
  - 2. Created deflection grants
  - 3. Eliminated citation process
- 2025: Senate Bill 610
  - 1. Makes the OAC advisory (OHA will make future BHRN funding decisions)
  - 2. Expands OAC membership

### Why the shift?

- Fentanyl exploded in Oregon
- Housing crisis
- Public drug use
- Crime trends (gun violence, domestic violence)
- Post pandemic economic impact to Portland
- Swinging pendulum of criminal justice policy and philosophy



# What are Behavioral Health Resource Networks?

#### **BHRN Overview**

- Each of Oregon's 36 Counties must have a BHRN, which is a collection of network providers that together provide:
  - screening,
  - assessment,
  - Substance Use Disorder services,
  - peer supports,
  - housing, and
  - harm reduction.
- Services must be free, and funds shall not supplant Medicaid or other resources.
- 234 providers across the state
- Current grant cycle: July 2025-June 2029



# Administration and evaluation

### **Administration and evaluation**

- 22 member team supports grant administration and OAC
- Improved data collection efforts underway:
  - Integrating BHRN data into statewide client-level system
  - Grant and expenditure administration
- Upcoming areas of focus:
  - Integrating BHRN services into statewide systems of care
  - Re-launching OAC with new members and group agreements
  - Legislative data report in April 2026
  - Preparation for 2029 funding cycle
