

Washington Preferred Drug List Archived & Eliminated Classes

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Background

- I6 drug classes and sub-classes on WA PDL that have been archived between 5-8 years with no updates in the market
- DERP has not done a review of these drug classes since they were archived
- Some classes are primarily OTC medications
 - UMP no longer manages due to benefit exclusion
- Combined Oral Contraceptives now required to be covered as preventive by federal law



Archived drug class process

- DERP will not do another review of a drug class
- HCA recommends drug class to be archived
- The P&T Committee will:
 - Review a final surveillance report of the drug class
 - Vote on whether the drug class is appropriate to archive
 - Determine if the TIP and DAW rules are appropriate to continue without further clinical review
 - Direct agencies to change preferred status of drugs based on cost when appropriate without additional review by the committee
- Archived drug classes will remain on the WA PDL for at least 2 years
- P&T Committee or HCA may re-activate an archived class if significant changes are made to the evidence base for the class or its indications



Elimination of drug classes from WA PDL

lf:

- Drug class has been archived at least 2 years
- No significant changes or additions to drug class are anticipated

Future decisions on eliminated drug classes:

- No longer follow motion recommendation
- UMP and L&I manage separately on their own formularies
