- Collaborating with the Club assures of better year round services. This is especially important since many of our children in the community backslide during the summer academically and emotionally.

In terms of implementation specifics, we are at an early conceptual development stage, so are not able to provide further specifics at this time. But recognizing that the need is great and the work of the HCA and the ACH's is groundbreaking and of vital importance to achieving healthier communities, we are submitting it now with high hopes it will make a difference.
