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
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

Service Hours by Location, SFY 2024




WISe Service Providers as of April 2025



Strengths are identified when the clinician rated a strengths item as a 0 ("significant strength") or 1 ("some strength") instead of a 2 ("potential strength") or 3 ("no strength identified at this time"). Most Recent 24 Months of Data


