WSP ROLE WITH HB 2951

- Requires WSP to conduct a study on increasing state resources for reporting and identifying missing Native American women in the state.
- WSP and GOIA will convene meetings to consult and collaborate with:
 - Tribal and local law enforcement
 - Federally recognized tribes
 - Urban Indian organizations

SHORT TERM GOALS

- Collect data on the number of missing Native American women
- Identify barriers
- Determine the scope of the problem
- Recommend solutions or resources to address the problem

WHAT HAVE WE LEARNED SO FAR?


CHALLENGES:

- No centralized resources
- Lack of access to systems
- Racial misclassification

- Create a toolkit(s) for families and law enforcement agencies
- Community outreach within the tribes
- Assign an advocate for the families
- Training for law enforcement

- SOR Additional Tribal Funding Requests
 - ▶ DTL Letter/email sent out Response requested by December 10, 2018
 - Up to 16 amendments to Tribes and 2 new contracts UIHP (updated plans are needed)
- SOR Tribal Opioid Workgroup
 - ► Identify contractor to facilitate workgroup (\$10,000)
 - Meet 4-6 times during contract period
 - Develop strategic plan and strategies to be embedded into Statewide Opioid Response Plan
 - ► Identify date for first meeting Suggestions



- ► The consultation outcome is for an agreement about having a single process for facilities which provide mental health (MH) and substance use disorders(SUD) for deeming, attestation, licensure.
- ▶ Is there something more (or different) than attestation for both MH/SUD providers that is being requested?
- Are there any questions about qualifications for providers? Is the change working, i.e, now there are no qualifications requirements.
- ► How is the current deeming process for both providers and facilities working?





• 4. With regard to the RCW and the Indian Health Care Provider process for behavioral health – what needs to be addressed by the end of the year to "ensure property certification for IHCPs providing behavioral health?
