


Washington's uninsured rate has dropped from **14%** to **6.6%**

2016 Highlights

- Launched the Uniform Medical Plan Plus (UMP PLUS) with two networks (PSHVN and UW ACN); Over 10,000 public employees and their dependents enrolled in UMP Plus in 2016
- Redesigned and procured a new Life insurance benefit, with a special enrollment opportunity for all employees (11/1-12/16/16) and new coverage effective 1/1/17
- Developed the Centers of Excellence (COE) Program using episode of care payments; launching total joint replacement (hip and/or knee) benefit 1/1/17
- Produced 175,000+ *1095 Forms* to employees and retirees, on behalf of 144 state agencies/higher education institutions, describing medical coverage offerings and enrollment as required by ACA

Case Example: Cascade Pacific Action Alliance

Youth Behavioral Health Coordination

Identify children with behavioral health challenges as early as possible in both education and health care settings, and connect at-risk children to community-based interventions and treatment services



Case Example: Greater Columbia

Readmission Avoidance Pilot

Coordinate clinical care and social supports for patients at risk for hospital readmission using a combination of care transition support and connections to social services

Medicaid Transformation Demonstration

- Five-year demonstration of innovative strategies to improve health outcomes and use resources wisely
- Authorizes up to \$1.5 billion in federal investments
- Three initiatives:
 1. Transformation through Accountable Communities of Health
 2. Long-term Services and Supports
 3. Foundational Community Support Services




Transformation Demonstration Examples
